| World Air Quality Report 2023<br>2023<br>World Air Quality<br>Report<br>Region & City PM2.5 Banking | <ul> <li>Context: <ul> <li>According to the IQ Air's(Swiss air quality monitoring body) 2023 World Air Quality Report, India was declared as the third-most polluted country, following Bangladesh and Pakistan.</li> <li>With an average annual PM2.5 concentration of 54.4 micrograms per cubic meter, India's air quality is a severe concern.</li> <li>In 2022, India was ranked the eighth-most polluted country.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>   |

|   | <ul> <li>Top 50 Polluted Cities Feature Indian Metropolitans <ul> <li>Out of the report's list of the top 50 most polluted cities, a staggering 42 cities were located in India.</li> <li>Begusarai in Bihar topped the chart as the most polluted metropolitan area in 2023, followed by Guwahati and Delhi.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>  |
|   | <ul> <li>Other Significant Findings of the Report <ul> <li>The report highlighted the air quality data gathered from 7,812 locations in 134 countries.</li> <li>The top five most polluted countries in 2023 were Bangladesh, Pakistan, India, Tajikistan, and Burkina Faso.</li> <li>Seven countries achieved the WHO annual PM2.5 guideline of an average of 5 µg/m3 or less, namely Australia, Estonia, Finland, Grenada, Iceland, Mauritius, and New Zealand.</li> <li>Africa remains deprived of air quality data, with one-third of the population lacking access.</li> <li>Nine out of the top ten most polluted cities belong to India.</li> </ul> </li> <li>China recorded a 6.3% PM2.5 rise in 2023, amounting to 32.5 micrograms after experiencing declines for five consecutive years.</li> <li>Canada emerged as the most polluted country in North America for the first time, with the region's 13 most polluted cities.</li> </ul> |

| South Africa<br>Cape Town                     | <ul> <li>About:</li> <li>The study focused on the Barberton Greenstone<br/>Belt, a complex geological formation in<br/>southern Africa, which holds one of the most<br/>extensive records of Earth's history between<br/>3.2 billion and 3.6 billion years ago.</li> <li>Researchers discovered similarities between the<br/>Barberton Greenstone Belt and younger rocks<br/>in New Zealand that experienced<br/>earthquake-triggered submarine landslides along<br/>the Hikurangi subduction zone.</li> <li>The findings suggest that massive earthquakes<br/>shaped the Barberton Greenstone Belt over<br/>millions of years, indicating that plate<br/>tectonics and associated geological events<br/>played a significant role in the early history of<br/>Earth.</li> <li>While there is no consensus on when plate<br/>tectonics began, the researchers believe that<br/>earthquakes and the energy they released could<br/>have contributed to creating conditions suitable for<br/>the emergence and survival of life.</li> </ul> |

|   | Neutrinos:<br>Neutrinos are the most abundant particles that have<br>mass in the universe. Every time atomic nuclei come<br>together (like in the sun) or break apart (like in a nuclear<br>reactor), they produce neutrinos. A neutrino is a fermion<br>that interacts only via weak interaction and gravity.   |
|   | <ul> <li>IceCube Neutrino Observatory:</li> <li>The IceCube Neutrino Observatory is the first detector of its kind, designed to observe the cosmos from deep within the South Pole ice.</li> <li>An international group of scientists responsible for the scientific research makes up the IceCube Collaboration.</li> <li>IceCube searches for nearly massless subatomic particles called neutrinos.</li> <li>These high-energy astronomical messengers provide information to probe the most violent astrophysical sources: events like exploding stars, gamma-ray bursts, and cataclysmic phenomena involving black holes and neutron stars.</li> </ul> |
