<p><b>Kisan Kavach</b></p>	<p><b>Context:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A team of Malayali scientists has developed a groundbreaking fabric called '<b>Kisan Kavach</b>' to protect farmers from the harmful effects of pesticide exposure, which often endangers their health.</li> </ul> <p><b>Key points:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This innovative fabric, chemically treated to neutralize pesticides, was created by researchers from the <b>Department of Biotechnology at the Institute for Stem Cell Science and Regenerative Medicine (inStem) in Bengaluru.</b></li> <li>This fabric aims to address the severe health issues farmers face due to pesticide exposure, such as vomiting, shortness of breath, tremors, blurred vision, muscle pain, and weakness.</li> <li>Durable and reusable for up to a year, '<b>Kisan Kavach</b>' represents a significant technological advancement.</li> <li>Its development has been recognized with a recent publication in the prestigious journal Nature Communications.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Onavillu</b></p>	<p><b>Context:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In Thiruvananthapuram, a legal dispute has emerged between the <b>Sree Padmanabhaswamy Temple administration and the Onavillu family regarding the trademark of Onavillu.</b></li> </ul> <p><b>About:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This bow-shaped religious artifact is traditionally offered to the deity of Padmanabhaswamy Temple on Thiruvonam day.</li> <li>The Onavillu consists of a wooden part adorned with paintings of the deity and red strings attached to it.</li> <li>This dispute echoes a previous legal battle where the <b>Attukal Temple Trust secured a trademark for the image of the deity and the title 'Sabarimala of women'.</b></li> </ul>



Kerala: 23,000+ Cyber Fraud Cases in 2023

**Context:**

- Kerala faced a significant surge in cyber fraud incidents, with over **23,000 complaints recorded in 2023**.
- Information based on complaints lodged on the **National Cybercrime Reporting Portal (NCRP)**.

**Cyber Security?**

- Cybersecurity refers to the practice of protecting computers, servers, networks, electronic systems, and digital data from unauthorised access, theft, damage, or disruption.
- It involves implementing measures and employing technologies and processes to ensure the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of information and systems.
- Cybersecurity is necessary to protect sensitive data, preserve operational continuity, and mitigate financial risks posed by evolving cyber threats and crimes in the digital landscape.

**Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C)**

**Establishment and Purpose:**

- The Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C) was established under the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) to comprehensively address cybercrime in India.
- Its primary objective is to enhance coordination among various Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) and stakeholders, ensuring a unified approach to tackling cybercrime issues that affect citizens.
- The I4C is headquartered in New Delhi.

**Functions:**

- The I4C serves as the central hub in the fight against cybercrime.
- It is tasked with identifying research problems and the needs of LEAs, undertaking research and development (R&D) activities to create new technologies and forensic tools in collaboration with both domestic and international academic and research institutions.
- Additionally, the centre works to prevent the misuse of cyberspace by extremist and terrorist groups.
- Another critical function of the I4C is to recommend necessary amendments to cyber laws to stay abreast of evolving technologies and foster international cooperation.
- It also coordinates activities related to the implementation of Mutual Legal Assistance Treaties (MLAT) concerning
