The project will be implemented by the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC). Open Market Sale Scheme (OMSS)	 Why in the news? The Centre recently allowed state governments to directly buy rice from the Food Corporation of India (FCI) without participating in e-auction under the open market sale scheme (domestic).
	About OMSS:













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	 Objectives of OMSS: Enhance the supply of food grains during the lean season. Moderate open market prices. Ensure food security. Control inflation, especially in deficit regions. About Food Corporation of India (FCI): Sells surplus food grains (wheat and rice) from the central pool to traders, bulk consumers, retail chains, etc. Operates on government instructions. Maintains buffer stocks and provisions for National Food Security Act (NFSA) and Other Welfare Schemes (OWS).
Disaster Management (Amendment Bill), 2024	 Why in the news? The bill seeks to amend the Disaster Management Act, 2005, aimed at effective disaster management. About Disaster Management (Amendment Bill), 2024: It proposes the constitution of "Urban Disaster Management Authority" for state capitals and large cities with municipal corporations, excluding Delhi and Chandigarh. The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) and State Disaster Management Authority is the National and State Disaster Plans at national and state levels, respectively, replacing the National and State Executive Committees. NDMA will have the authority to appoint experts and consultants to fulfill its functions effectively. A "disaster database" will be created at national and state levels, including disaster assessment, fund allocation, expenditure, preparedness and mitigation plans, and risk registers. The bill grants statutory recognition to the National Crisis Management Committee and the High-Level Committee. It includes provisions for the establishment of a "State Disaster Response Force" by state governments. A new Section 60A empowers the Central and State Governments to direct individuals to take necessary actions or refrain from them to mitigate disaster impacts, with penalties for non-compliance up to ₹10,000.

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
