The Commission has been requested to make its report available by 31st October, 2025.
New ward structure in Kerala panchayats	Why in news? ■ The new ward structure in Kerala panchayats will increase the number of representatives and enhance women's reservation.
	 Key Points: The number of wards in the three-tier panchayats has been revised as part of the division of local body wards. The previous count of 15,962 wards across 15,962 wards across 941 gram panchayats will now increase to 17,337, with the number of gram panchayats rising to 1,375.

The ratings of institutions range from A++ to C. If an institution is graded D, it means it is not accredited.
