Мрох	<ul> <li>Why in news?         <ul> <li>Recently, a Malappuram resident was hospitalized with suspected Mpox symptoms after returning from Dubai.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Key Points:         <ul> <li>Mpox, caused by the monkeypox virus (MPXV), is an infectious disease that can give a painful rash, enlarged lymph nodes, fever, headache, muscle ache, back pain and low energy.</li> <li>Mpox spreads from person to person mainly through close contact with an infected person.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Nipah virus	<ul> <li>Why in news?         <ul> <li>The 24-year-old man who died recently at a private hospital in Malappuram was infected with the Nipah virus.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Key Points:         <ul> <li>Nipah virus infection in humans causes a range of clinical presentations, from asymptomatic infection (subclinical) to acute respiratory infection and fatal encephalitis.</li> <li>Nipah virus can be transmitted to humans from animals (such as bats or pigs), or contaminated foods and can also be transmitted directly from human-to-human.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Leptospirosis	<ul> <li>Why in news? <ul> <li>253 deaths due to leptospirosis (rat fever) have been officially reported in Kerala.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Key Points: <ul> <li>Leptospirosis is a bacterial infection that can affect both people and animals.</li> <li>It's caused by the bacterium Leptospira, which can be found in contaminated water or soil.</li> <li>Symptoms include fever, headache, muscle aches, vomiting, or diarrhea. Symptoms can take 2 to 30 days to develop.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Mullaperiyar Dam	<ul> <li>Why in news?</li> <li>The supervisory panel has cleared the Mullaperiyar dam of concerns ahead of its safety inspection.</li> </ul>
