PM-USHA Scheme	 Context: Kannur University has secured ₹100 crore under the PM-USHA (Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan) Scheme. As part of this, a total allocation of ₹405 crore for higher education infrastructure improvements in Kerala. Key Points: The financial aid, granted under the Multidisciplinary Education and Research Universities (MERU) category, will be split between the Central Government (60%) and the State Government (40%). The initiative is designed to enhance the higher education ecosystem by promoting excellence and equity, said a University press release. About: PM USHA is a centrally sponsored scheme under the Ministry of Education aimed at improving the quality and access to higher education across the country. Key Focus Areas: Equity: Increasing access to quality higher education for underrepresented groups. Excellence: Enhancing the quality of teaching-learning processes and research. Infrastructure Development: Improving physical and digital infrastructure in higher education institutions. Teacher Training: Strengthening teacher training programs to enhance teaching quality. Employability: Enhancing the employability of graduates through skill development programs and industry collaborations. Funding: PM-USHA is funded jointly by the Central and State Governments. Report (ISFR) 2023.

 Between 2013 and 2023, the State's total forest cover also increased by 133.42 sq.km, a growth of 19.99%, marking one of the highest growth rates in the country.

About:

- The India State of Forest Report (ISFR) 2023 reveals that India's forest and tree cover has increased to 25.17% of the geographical area, totaling approximately 827,357 square kilometers.
- This includes 715,343 square kilometers of forest cover (21.76%) and 112,014 square kilometers of tree cover (3.41%).
- The report highlights a total increase of 1,445 square kilometers since the last assessment in 2021, with significant contributions from states like Chhattisgarh, Uttar Pradesh, and Odisha.

Reserve Bank of India's 'Handbook of Statistics on Indian States 2023-24

Context:

- As per the Reserve Bank of India's 'Handbook of Statistics on Indian States 2023-24', Kerala's economic growth has been notably sluggish, with an average annual growth rate of just 3.16% over the five years from 2018-19 to 2022-23.
- Kerala took the 30th spot, among 33 states and Union territories (UTs), in terms of economic growth over a five-year period.

Key Points:

- Kerala's average annual growth rate (AAGR) in gross state domestic product (GSDP, at constant prices) between 2018-19 and 2022-23 stood at 3.16%, with only Delhi (3.13%), Uttarakhand (2.16%) and Goa (0.70%) performing worse.
- Mizoram topped the chart with 6.75% growth, followed by Chhattisgarh (6.64%) and Gujarat (6.26%).
- Major south Indian states also registered commendable growth during the period.
- While Karnataka's economy grew by 5.62%, Telangana, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh posted 5.61%, 5.27% and 5.19% expansions, respectively.
- The quick estimate for 2023-24 showed that Kerala's GSDP improved to Rs 6.35 lakh crore, posting a 6.52% year-on-year (YoY) growth, from the previous year's Rs 5.96 lakh crore (+4.24% YoY).
- The handbook did not have data for all states/UTs for this year
- Telangana's growth rate was pegged at 9.24%, followed by Tamil Nadu (8.23%), Andhra Pradesh (7.35%), and Karnataka (6.60%).

Madavoorpara becomes first green tourism centre

Context:

- Madavoorpara, located in the Kattayikonam division of Thiruvananthapuram, has been officially declared the first green tourism center in Kerala.
- This designation aims to promote sustainable tourism practices while preserving the area's natural beauty and cultural heritage.
- It is as part of the Malinya Muktham Nava Kerala campaign that the tourist spots within city corporation limits are transforming into green tourism centre.

Key Points:

- The project is implemented jointly by the Haritha Keralam Mission, city corporation, and the department of archaeology under the leadership of the Nava Kerala Mission.
- All types of waste discarded by tourists in tourist spots, which harm nature and the environment, are collected and processed to declare the tourism sector as green spaces.
- So far in the district, 368 schools, 44 colleges, 1,425 institutions, 15 towns, and 5 tourist centres have achieved green status.

About:

Malinya Muktham Nava Keralam:

- "Malinya Muktham Nava Keralam" translates to "Waste-Free New Kerala" in English.
- It is a flagship campaign launched by the Kerala government with the ambitious goal of transforming the state into a waste-free and environmentally sustainable region.
