# Arun Yogiraj's idol of Ram Lalla chosen for Ayodhya's grand temple

- Days after the idol of Lord Ram Lalla for 'Pran Pratishtha' (consecration) was finalized by the temple trust in Ayodhya, Union minister Pralhad Joshi said that renowned sculptor Arun Yogiraj's idol of Ram Lalla has been chosen for installation in the grand Ram Janmabhoomi temple in Ayodhya.
- The grand consecration ceremony of Ram temple will be held on January 22.

### Who is Arun Yogiraj?

- Sculptor Yogiraj hails from a lineage of five generations of renowned sculptors in Mysore. Yogiraj started his sculpting career at a young age and was highly influenced by his father, Yogiraj, and grandfather, Basavanna Shilpi, who enjoyed the patronage of the King of Mysore.
- After pursuing an MBA and working in the corporate sector, Yogiraj started pursuing sculpting full time from 2008.
- Besides Ram Lalla idol, Yogiraj has carved an array of impressive sculptures, including a 30feet statue of Subhash Chandra Bose displayed behind the Amar Jawan Jyoti near India Gate in Delhi.
- His other notable contributions include a 12feet tall sculpture of Adi Shankaracharya in Kedarnath to a 21-feet tall Hanuman statue in Mysore.

## PM Modi to inaugurate Mumbai Trans Harbour Link

- PM Modi will inaugurate the Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL) on January 12.
- This MTHL project is said to be the country's longest sea bridge.
- It is expected to drastically reduce travel time between Mumbai and Navi Mumbai from a current 2 hours to approximately 15-20 minutes
- Its **length is 21.8 kilometers** (comprising 16.5 km over the sea and 5.5 km on land)

## MH CM to attend Akhand Harinam Saptah

 The MH CM is expected to take part in state's largest Akhand Harinam Saptah organized at the foothills of Shri Malang Gad hill of Thane District.

#### About:

- The Akhand Harinam Saptah is a week-long spiritual festival observed by devotees of Lord Vishnu, particularly those belonging to the Varkari Sampradaya in Maharashtra.
- The festival is characterized by uninterrupted chanting of the name "Hari" by devotees throughout the seven days.

# Ram temple inauguration likely to generate ₹50,000cr business

- The Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT) has estimated that business worth Rs 50,000 crore will be generated in the country following the inauguration of the Ram temple at Ayodhya in January
- The Ram Temple holds immense religious significance for Hindus, and millions are expected to visit Ayodhya for the inauguration and darshan (viewing the deity).
- According to CAIT, there is a large demand for special cloth garlands, lockets, key chains, pictures of Ram Darbar, models of Ram temples, Ram Dhwaja, and Ram Angvastra imprinted with the image of Lord Ram across different Indian markets.
- This influx of pilgrims will also boost demand for various goods and services like travel, accommodation, food, souvenirs, and religious items.

# Newlyweds to get wedding sets from Mangoan panchayat

- The gram panchayat of Mangaon village in Kolhapur district has decided to gift wedding sets worth Rs 11,000 to all women getting married.
- The sets will be funded through the honorarium of the sarpanch, deputy sarpanch, panchayat members, and the gram panchayat corpus.

- These are mobile units that travel to remote villages within the buffer zone of the Pench Tiger Reserve
- It offers a range of services including:
- Online services
- Banking services
- Recharge facilities
- Utility bill payments
- Information dissemination

- A consortium led by Adani Infrastructure Developers Ltd.(AIDPL) has partnered with several renowned firms for this master plan preparation
- Aim is to improve the lives of Dharavi's residents while creating a model for sustainable urban development.

## Ajit Pawar pays tributes at Koregaon Bhima war memorial

MH Deputy CM Ajit Pawar paid respects at the Jay Stambh (Victory Pillar) near Pune, commemorating the 206th anniversary of the Battle of Koregaon Bhima.

### **Key Points:**

- The Battle of Koregaon Bhima was fought on January 1, 1818.
- The battle was part of the Third Anglo-Maratha War. a conflict for control of vast swathes of India.
- The battle holds immense significance for the Dalit community in India, marking their victory over the Peshwa army of the Maratha Empire.

## Yadav dynasty of Maharashtra (Static)

- Yadava dynasty, are rulers of a 12th-14thcentury Hindu kingdom of central India what is now the Indian state of Maharashtra.
- Originally feudatory of the Eastern Chalukyas of Kalyani, the dynasty became paramount in the Deccan under **Bhillama** (c. 1187–91), who founded Devagiri (later Daulatabad) as his capital.
- Under Bhillama's grandson Singhana (reigned c. 1210-47) the dynasty reached its height, as the Yadava campaigned against the Hoysalas in the south, the Kakatiyas in the east, and the Paramaras and Chalukyas in the north.
- During the reign of the last Yadava king. Ramachandra (reigned 1271-c. 1309), a Muslim army commanded by the Delhi sultan 'Ala' al-Dīn Khaljī invaded the kingdom in 1294 and imposed tributary status.

# Ramlalla's Seating Ceremony on 22nd January

- From Vaikom to Ayodhya, the Hindu community has come a long way.
- Ceremony is going to be held with great pomp on Jan 22.
- Significant changes like Ayodhya Dham Airport being renamed after Maharishi Valmiki, tells a loud and clear message of social assimilation, justice and harmony — this is what was envisioned by Babasaheb Ambedkar.
- The Maharishi Valmiki International Airport Dham will link to the divine and majestic Ram Temple.
- The newly built airport has the capacity to serve 10 lakh travellers annually.

# MMRDA merges monorail with metro operations

- The Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) has merged the Monorail Project Implementation Unit with the Maha Mumbai Metro Operation Corporation to revive the struggling Mumbai Monorail.
- The merger aims to improve operation, cut costs, and save expenses.
- The move is expected to save over ₹40 to 60 crore annually and reduce duplication of manpower.

# MSEDCL supplies electricity to 2,395 tribal homes in Maharashtra in 12 days

 The Maharashtra state Electricity distribution company Itd( MSEDCL) has achieved a significant milestone by supplying electricity to vulnerable tribal communities

- in remote areas of the state within just 12 days
- It was done in view of Pradhan Mantri Janjati
  Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan schemes
  initiatied by PM Modi

# PM Modi to inaugurate major Infra-projects in Navi Mumbai

- PM Modi will lay the foundation stone of two underground road projects in South Mumbai and Thane.
- He will also inaugurate Phase II of Nerul/Belapur - Uran railway lines as part of Mumbai Trans- Harbour Link (MTHL) project
- He will also officially inaugurate Digha station on the Airoli- Kalwa route of the Central railway's Trans-Harbour Link.

 The MH state government has appointed 1988 batch Indian Police Service (IPS) officer Rashmi Shukla as the Maharashtra director general of police (DGP)

## MH state takes wine promotion scheme off ice

- The MH government has decided to revive the Wine Industrial Promotion Scheme (WIPS) for five years.
- The scheme was initially launched in 2020 but faced a major opposition and thus was put on ice for nearly a year.

### **Key Points:**

- 1. Wine Festivals and Events:
  - The scheme will allow the organization of wine festivals and events across the state, promoting wine tourism and local wineries.
- 2. Direct Sales at Wineries:
  - Wineries will be permitted to sell wine directly to consumers at their premises, boosting their sales and outreach.
- 3. Training and Skill Development:
  - The scheme will also focus on training programs and skill development initiatives
- 4. VAT Refund:
  - The 20% VAT refund to wineries is a significant incentive, aimed at easing





their financial burden and mendorong investment in the sector

## CSMT gets IR's first AC odorless toilet block

- Mumbai's Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (CSMT), formerly Victoria Terminus, has taken a significant step towards improving passenger experience with the inauguration of India's first air-conditioned odorless toilet block.
- This modern facility promises not only comfort and hygiene but also sets a new standard for railway station amenities.

# **QR Code Placed To Get Information About Trees In Thane Municipal Parks**

- The QR code has been placed on the trees so that the citizens can easily get information about the trees in the parks in the Thane municipal area.
- After scanning this code on the mobile phone, information about the tree will be available to the citizens in two languages, Marathi and English.

## Govt fixes MTHL toll at ₹250 per car

 The Maharashtra government has finalized the toll charges for the Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL), also known as the Atal Setu, at ₹250 per car for a single trip.

- It connects Sewri in Mumbai to Nhava Sheva in Raigad district.

# Kajal Kambale becomes First Disabled Female Climber to Scale Lingana Fort

 Kajal Kambale, a disabled mountaineer from Maharashtra, has become the first female mountaineer with any disability to conquer the challenging Lingana Fort in the Sahyadri range.

#### About:

- Lingana, a sub-fort of the iconic Raigad, holds historical significance as the "prison" of the Maratha Empire, contrasting Raigad's role as the "capital."
- Its name is derived from the resemblance to a "Linga" (a phallic symbol in Hinduism)

# Maharashtra reports highest dog bites in India in 2023

- Maharashtra reported the maximum number of dog bite cases in 2023, with over 4.35 lakh incidents.
- It is nearly 11% more than 2022
- It was followed by Tamil Nadu with 4,04,488 cases.
- The rise in cases was attributed to high reporting in Maharashtra. Mumbai, Thane, and Pune had the highest number of cases due to poor sterilization implementation.

# Maharashtra Cabinet Approves Old Pension Scheme For Govt Employees

 The Maharashtra govt has approved a proposal offering the Old Pension Scheme (OPS) as an option for state government employees who joined service after November 1, 2005.

#### About:

- The OPS is a retirement pension scheme where government employees receive a monthly pension equivalent to 50% of their last drawn salary.
- The employee does not contribute to the pension fund, and the entire burden is borne by the government.

## **World Braille Day**

- World Braille Day is celebrated annually on January 4th
- It commemorates the birthday of Louis Braille, the inventor of the braille writing system.
- This day serves as a vital reminder of the importance of access to information and communication for people who are blind or visually impaired
- The theme for World Braille Day 2024 is "Empowering Through Inclusion and Diversity"

# Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj's Tiger Claw arrival delayed Again

 The Wagh Nakh (Tiger claw) of Chatrapatti Shivaji Maharaj from the Victoria and Albert Museum in London will be delayed to arrive in Maharashtra in May due to delay in the legal process of bringing them.





• Earlier, it was said that the tiger claw would come to India in November and then in January.

### **National Birds Day**

- National Bird Day on January 5 highlights the importance of small birds in the ecosystem.
- Led by the Avian Welfare Coalition, the day focuses on raising awareness about birds in captivity, emphasizing the need to protect them from exploitation for profit or entertainment.
- The Indian peacock, with its majestic plumage and captivating dance, is the national bird of India.

### **National Birds Day 2024: Theme**

- The theme of this year's National Birds Day is 'Right To Fight'.
- It resonates with the flight of a bird that symbolises freedom. With this campaign, the Avian Welfare Coalition aims to reduce the suffering of birds by raising public awareness of the destructive bird trade, the realities of cruel bird breeding mills and the ways to improve the welfare of birds already in captivity.

## Coastal road project

- The first phase of the coastal road, from Worli to Marine Drive, will be completed by January 31.It is likely to be toll free.
- The remaining part of the road will be opened by May 2024.
- Also, the Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL) project will be opened soon.
- The MTHL will be inaugurated by PM Narendra Modi on January 12.

# Decrease in Nashik city road accident numbers in 2023

- Nashik, Maharashtra, has seen a slight decline in the number of road accidents in 2023 compared to the previous year.
- In 2023, Nashik city witnessed a 6% reduction in fatalities.
- In 2023, there were 194 road accident deaths, a decrease from 207 in 2022.
- Also, the number of people injured in road accidents saw a 13% decrease.
- It dipped from 540 in 2022 to 468 in 2023

#### Govt amends PM-eBus Sewa tender

- The Union government has recently amended the PM-eBus Sewa scheme launched in 2023 to include 100 low-floor buses that are more accessible to persons with disabilities compared to the ones with standard floor.
- Center amended a tender for the procurement of 3,600 electric buses to address concerns raised by disability rights activists regarding the accessibility of the initially proposed standard-floor buses.

- It is located at the disputed site of Ram Janmabhoomi, believed to be the birthplace of Lord Rama.
- The Temple will be inaugrated on January 22, 2024

## 7.95L prize money for Vid athletics

- Over 1,500 athletes from across Vidarbha will take part in the athletics competition in the sixth edition of Khasdar Krida Mahotsav (KKM)
- The event will begin at the synthetic track of Divisional Sports Complex in Mankapur from January 13.
- The four-day event will carry a prize money of 7.95 lakh and a total of 116 events in six age categories for men and women.

- Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (Overseas Indian Day) is a national day in India celebrated on January 9th every year.

# 100 percent land acquired for Mumbai-Ahmedabad bullet train project

- National High Speed Rail Corporation Ltd (NHSRCL) has achieved 100 percent land acquisition for Mumbai-Ahmedabad bullet train project
- NHSRCL is the executing the Mumbai-Ahmedabad High Speed rail corridor,
- A total of 1389 hectares of land was required,
- It included 951.14 ha in Gujarat, 430.45 hectares in Maharashtra and 7.9 hectares in Dadra and Nagar Haveli.

# White toxic foam in River Indrayani rankles Maharashtra

- The Indrayani River, a vital lifeline for Pune and surrounding areas, has been choked by a thick layer of white, toxic foam, sparking outrage and concern across Maharashtra.
- The frothy menace is attributed to industrial pollutants and untreated sewage
- It poses serious health risks to aquatic life and nearby communities.

#### Sources of the Foam:

- 1. Untreated industrial effluents
- 2. Domestic sewage
- 3. Use of detergents etc,.

# MOIL to bring country's longest triathlon to city


- The country's longest triathlon, Tigerman Triathlon, will be organized by Manganese Ore India Ltd (MOIL) Ltd in Nagpur on February 10 and 11.
- Amit Samarth, the finisher of Race Across America, is the race director of the two-day event, presented by the largest manganese ore producer in the country, MOIL Limited, with an aim to foster health, sports and community empowerment.
- The competition will start with the participants swimming 5 kms in the Ambazari lake, before taking a 200km cycle ride and concluding with a 50km run.

# Summer onion plantation area falls by 50% in Nashik

- The poor monsoon is affecting summer onion plantation in Nashik district.
- This year, summer onions have been planted on 81,000 hectares, compared to 2.2 lakh hectares last year.
- The low plantation will impact the availability of onions in the markets from April, leading to higher prices.







# KMC converts roadside garbage dumping spot into public garden

- The Kolhapur Municipal Corporation (KMC) has converted a roadside garbage dumping and waste disposal site near the land records office in Mangalwar Peth into a garden.
- A tree plantation drive is also being carried out to give the surrounding area a new look.
- The road passing through the land records office is a bypass for motorists going towards the race course.

# MH among top 3 States to contribute 40% of registered MSMEs in India

- As per a CBRE-CREDAI report, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, and Uttar Pradesh collectively contribute nearly 40 percent of all registered micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in India
- According to government data, as of December 2023, there are over 3 crore MSMEs registered in the country

# Maharashtra's Mahanand Dairy board passes resolution for takeover by NDDB

 The board of directors at Mahanand Dairy, a once-profitable venture under the Maharashtra government, has sanctioned a resolution to transfer the dairy's control

- to the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB).
- However, milk producers in the State are expressing concerns and alleging that the government and the board have decided to facilitate Amul's expansion in Maharashtra.

# IAF to Organise Aerial Display in Mumbai from January 12 to 14

- The IAF will organize an aerial display in Mumbai as part of the Indian Air Force outreach programme in coordination with the Government of Maharashtra from January 12 to 14 between 12 pm to 1 pm over Marine Drive
- The displays and demonstrations by IAF personnel and aircraft will showcase the skills, capabilities and professionalism of the force.

### VIIT bags top prize in poster presentation

- Vignan's Institute of Information Technology (Autonomous) (VIIT) campus bagged the first prize in poster presentation at Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) regional meet organized by the Ministry of Education (MoE).
- The main objective of the IICs is to show how MoE and All India Council for Technical Education support innovation and development in educational institutions.

# Ports Minister optimistic about job surge with planned Wadhwan port

- Union Ports Minister Sarbanand Sonowal said that the proposed Wadhwan port near Dahanu will fuel substantial industrial growth in the region
- It will also create job opportunities for thousands of young individuals.

#### About:

- Wadhwan Port, also known as Vadhavan Port, is a proposed deep-sea port located on the coast of Maharashtra,
- It's envisioned as India's first foreshore port
- The project is a joint venture between Jawaharlal Nehru Port Trust (JNPT) and the Maharashtra Maritime Board

# PM to launch projects worth Rs 30,500 crore in Maharashtra

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi would launch, commission and dedicate projects to the tune of Rs 30,500 crore in Maharashtra.
- He will also inaugurate, dedicate to the nation and lay the foundation stone of multiple development projects worth more than Rs 12,700 crore in the public programme in Navi Mumbai.
- He would lay the foundation stone of the underground road tunnel connecting Eastern Freeway's Orange Gate to Marine Drive.
- It will reduce travel time between Orange Gate and Marine Drive.

## Jijabai Jayanti 2024

- The 426th birth anniversary of Rajmata Jijabai was celebrated with grand celebrations at the Rajwad (palace) of Raja Lakhhuji Rao Jadhav in Sindkhed Raja.
- She is the mother of the Maratha warrior king Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj.
- Descendants of the Jadhav clan from Sindkhed Raja and nearby villages, including Kinagaon Raja, Umerad, Deulgaon Raja, gathered at the palace to perform a grand puja (prayer ceremony) at the sacred site believed to be Jijabai's birthplace.

## Navi Mumbai Airport to Open by Year-End

- Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia announced that the long-awaited Navi Mumbai international airport will begin operations by November or December this year.
- At least 10 Indian cities will have two airports each within the next 10 to 15 years.
- Navi Mumbai airport's opening marks the culmination of a 60-year wait for connecting Mumbai with its satellite city.

- Mumbai's Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Park Art Festival returned for its third edition.
- It offers a vibrant showcase of art forms and provides a platform for artists to connect with art lovers and potential buyers.

## **Atal Setu Bridge**

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL), known as Atal Setu, today, marking a historic moment in India's infrastructure development.
- It is dedicated to the memory of the late BJP veteran and former PM Atal Bihari Vajpayee.

#### **Key Features:**

• Length and Lanes: Atal Setu is a 6-lane bridge spanning 21.8 km, making it the longest sea bridge in India.





Geographic Extent: Connecting Sewri in Mumbai to Nhava Sheva in Uran taluka, Raigad district, the bridge is expected to have a transformative impact on the region's economic development and connectivity.

Road crash fatalities in Maharashtra saw a slight decrease in 2023

### **Key Points:**

- Nearly 32% decrease can be seen in road
- The overall death toll dropped marginally from 15,224 in 2022 to 15,009 last year.

- Every year on January 15th, India celebrates **Army Day**, a day to honor the dedication and sacrifice of the brave men and women who safeguard our nation.
- This day marks the historic event of Lieutenant General Kodandera M. Cariappa taking over as the first Indian Commanderin-Chief of the Indian Army on January 15,


