1. Scorn (verb)

Meaning; To feel or display contempt or disdain



- Synonyms: disrespect
- Antonyms: respect
- Sentence Example: She scorned the advice of her ophthalmologist and had the laser eye surgery anyway.
- Verb (Definition): Verbs are words that show an action (sing), occurrence (develop), or state of being (exist).

2. Incipient (adjective)

Meaning; In an initial stage; beginning



- Synonyms: beginning, commencing
- Antonyms: mature, developed
- Sentence Example: I have an *incipient* dislike and distrust of that guy, and I only met him this morning.
- **Adjective (Definition):** *Adjectives* describe or modify—that is, they limit or restrict the meaning of—nouns and pronouns. They may name qualities of all kinds: *huge*, *red*, *angry*, *tremendous*, *unique*, *rare*, etc.


3. Recalcitrant (adjective)

Meaning; Marked by a stubborn unwillingness to obey authority.









- Synonyms: unmanageable, stubborn
- Antonyms: manageable, compliant
- **Sentence Example:** A heart-to-heart talk with the *recalcitrant* youth revealed that he had a troubled life at home.
- **Adjective (Definition):** *Adjectives* describe or modify—that is, they limit or restrict the meaning of—nouns and pronouns. They may name qualities of all kinds: *huge*, *red*, *angry*, *tremendous*, *unique*, *rare*, etc.
