In Maharashtra, they are on the Vimukta Jati and Nomadic Tribes (VJNT) list. Estimated population: Around 1 crore, comprising about 9% of Maharashtra's total population. Occupation and Lifestyle: Primary occupation: Sheep and goat herding. Lifestyle: Mix of nomadic pastoralism, semi-nomadic, and agrarian lifestyles in rural areas. Seasonal Migration: The Dhangar tribe undertakes annual migration after the bajra harvest in October, seeking greener pastures for their cattle.

Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act					

Why in the news?

- The Bombay High Court said that the school authorities were aware of the incident but kept silent and did not inform the police.
- Under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, non-reporting of a sexual assault is also an offence, said the court.

About POCSO Act:

- Enacted by the Government of India to safeguard children from sexual abuse and offences.
- Defines a child as any person below the age of 18 years.
- Amended in 2019 to introduce more stringent punishments, including the death penalty for severe sexual crimes against children.
- **Key Provisions:**
 - Gender-neutral Legislation: The Act defines a child as "any person" under the age of 18, irrespective of gender.
 - Non-reporting is a Crime: Any person in charge of an institution (excluding children) who fails to report a sexual offence involving a subordinate faces punishment.
 - No Time Limit for Reporting Abuse: A victim can report an offence at any time, even years after the abuse has occurred.
 - Confidentiality of Victim's Identity: The Act prohibits disclosing the victim's identity in any form of media unless authorised by the special courts established by the Act.

The **Maharashtra government** is moving forward with the implementation of the Shakti Criminal Laws (Maharashtra Amendment Bill), which introduces strict punishments for crimes against women, including the death penalty.

About Shakti Criminal Laws:

The Shakti Criminal Laws (Maharashtra Amendment) Bill, 2020, commonly known as the Shakti Bill, was introduced to amend the Indian Penal Code (IPC), the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), and the Protection of Children from
