Constructed at Mazagon Dock Limited in Mumbai. Participated in major Naval Operations: Op Parakram (2002) Op Sukoon (2006): Evacuation of Indian, Nepalese, and Sri Lankan citizens from Lebanon. Op Rahat (2015): Evacuation of Indian and foreign nationals from Yemen.

	 About Lakhpati Didi: The Lakhpati Didi initiative is a significant program aimed at empowering women in rural India. Key Aspects of Lakhpati Didi: Objective: To create three crore 'lakhpati didis' (prosperous sisters) across India by enabling them to earn at least ₹1 lakh per annum. Implementation: The scheme is implemented through Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and involves skill development, financial assistance, and capacity



Trade Marks Act, 1999	 Why in the news? The Bombay High Court has granted interim relief to Burger King in a trademark infringement case, restraining a Pune-based eatery from using the brand name until September 6. About Trade Marks Act, 1999:
	 It governs the registration, protection, and enforcement of trademarks. Purpose: The Act provides legal protection for trademarks, preventing unauthorized use and infringement. Trademark Definition: A trademark includes any sign capable of being represented graphically and distinguishing the goods or services of one person from those of others. This can include words, logos, symbols, colors, shapes, and even sounds. Rights Conferred by Registration: Registration grants the owner exclusive rights to use the trademark in relation to the goods or services for which it is registered. The owner can prevent others from using an identical or confusingly similar mark. Duration and Renewal: A registered trademark is valid for 10 years and can be renewed indefinitely for additional 10-year periods. Appellate Board: The Act establishes an Intellectual Property Appellate Board (IPAB) to hear appeals against decisions of the register. This legislation is crucial for protecting brand identity and ensuring fair trade practices in the


