#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

You do not know / of him / leaving the town. / NE

Replace HIM by HIS in part 'B'. OF is a preposition, and it should be followed by an object. HIM LEAVING THE TOWN if taken as an object, we must replace HIM (pronoun) by HIS (adjective) as TOWN is already an object.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

Abusing his wife is / worse than any sin / a man can commit in all his life. / NE

Insert OTHER between ANY and SIN in part 'B' or replace the whole part 'B' by THE WORST SIN.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

Computers give us / an easier access / to information. / NE

Replace EASIER by EASY in part 'B'. EASIER is the comparative degree of EASY; and the comparative degree is used in comparison. Here there is no comparison.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

None of / the twins / offered tea to me. / NE

Replace NONE by NEITHER in part 'A'. TWIN means TWO, and for two NEITHER is used; not NONE



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

The reporter / was unable / to illicit information from the police. / NE

Replace ILLICIT by ELICIT in part 'C' as we need an infinitive (first form of a verb) here. ELICIT is a verb and ILLICIT an adjective.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

These all / mangoes / are ripe. / NE

Replace 'THESE ALL' by 'ALL OF THESE' or 'ALL THESE' in part 'A'. The word ALL here can be used as an ADJECTIVE or a PRONOUN or an ADVERB. ALL as a pronoun can be followed by OF + THE/THIS/THESE/THAT/ THOSE/POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES + NOUNS. The word OF here is often omitted. So ALL THESE and ALL OF THESE both are equally correct.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

The news / I have received / is not good. / NE

Replace HAVE RECEIVED by RECEIVED in part 'B'



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

After Sheetal will return (A)/ from Delhi(B) / I will go to meet her. (C) / No error(D)

#### -omit will

We do not use "will" after the time clause. 'After' is a time expression, so we will not use "will".



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

I used to work (A) /till 11 pm and (B) / then I go to bed. (C) /No error (D)

C

'Used to' is used for past habitual action, so replace go with went.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

My younger brother (A)/ has left (B) /for Bhopal last Saturday. (C) /No error(D)

b

It is clearly mentioned that the activity is of last Saturday use simple past in part B, so omit 'has'.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

Air pollution caused by industrial effluents has been studied (A)/ for years, but only recently has (B)/ the harmful effects of noise pollution become known.(C)/No error(D)

b

use have instead of has as harmful effects of noise pollution is plural.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

The judge asked the lady (A)/ if the bag she had lost(B)/ contain ten thousand rupees (C)/No error (D)

C

Replace contain with contained as the sentence is in the past tense.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

The ministry was considered several proposals (A)/ for the development of small and medium enterprises (B)/during Budget discussions.(C)/No error (D)

A

Use simple past tense. (The ministry considered several proposals)



### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

Having work(A)/ in both public and private sector banks(B)/she is the most suitable person to take over the post of the chairman.(C)/No error(D)

A

Replace work by worked as the sentence is of past tense.



#### **ERROR DETECTION. ARJUN BATCH @ 3 PM**

Rohit started a very small business two years ago (A)/ but it grew very fast (B)/as the country is experiencing a boom at that time.(C)/No error(D)

C

The sentence is in the past tense, so use was experiencing.
