

S1. Ans.(b)

Sol. Doubtful is the correct answer.

Doubtful: feeling uncertain about something.

Sol. As this is a Present perfect continuous tense, according to the structure of the sentence ("Subject+ have been +verb +ing + object +since/for") 'am' will be replaced by 'have been'.

Sol. The last part of the sentence i.e. 'for the last five years' indicates that the sentence will be in present perfect continuous tense. Hence, we need to replace "is" in part A with "has been" to make the sentence grammatically correct.






