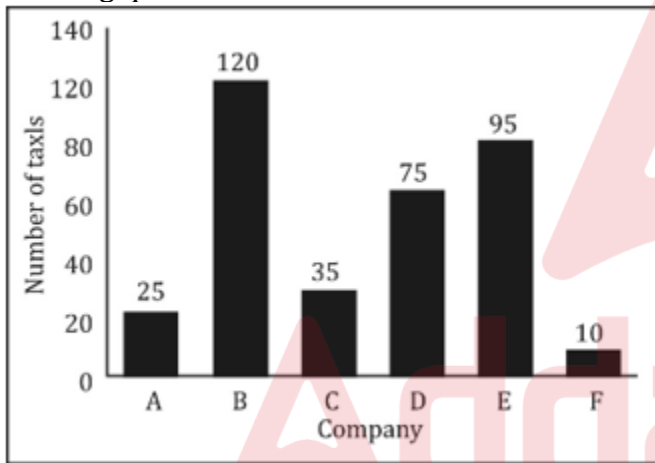

In response to this, some nationalist leaders, including Chittaranjan Das and Motilal Nehru, formed the Swarajya Party, with the goal of achieving self-government or Swaraj (self-rule) for India through constitutional means.
