Manipur PSC Preliminary Exam Pattern 2023

The Manipur PSC Preliminary Exam Pattern for 2023 consists of two papers, each carrying 200 marks. Both papers are objective in nature, with multiple-choice questions (MCQs) as the format. The duration of each paper is two hours. Paper-I covers General Studies, while Paper II covers Civil Service Aptitude Test (CSAT) and includes topics like comprehension, logical reasoning, decision-making, data interpretation, etc. Only those candidates who qualify in the Preliminary exam will be eligible to appear for the Main exam.

Manipur PSC Mains Exam Pattern 2023

- The Manipur PSC Mains exam will be conducted for a total of 1250 marks.
- The exam will be descriptive in nature and will consist of 6 papers.
- One of the papers will be on the English Language, and it will be of qualifying nature.
- The papers on English will be conducted at the Matriculation or equivalent standard.
- Each paper in the Mains exam will be conducted for a duration of 3 hours.
