Champaknagar within the jurisdiction of Jirania Sub-Division. Has the Executive Magistrate of Sadar jurisdiction to proceed against Mr. A under section 107 of Cr. P C, 1973?

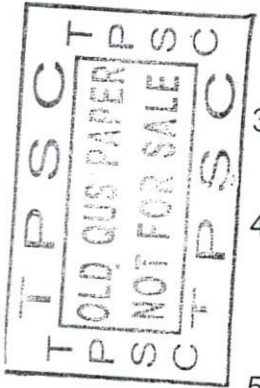
- (v) Is the Panchayet, having power to try and determine suits, a Court of justice?

- (v) A sale deed, required to be stamped by law, was not duly stamped. Is it admissible in evidence?

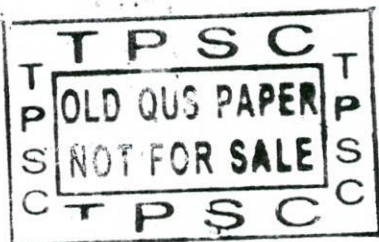
- (vi) The licencing authority grants licence under section 3 of the Arms Act, 1959 for a period of four years at a time. Does the licencing authority commit any wrong?

2. Translate the following passage into Bengali : 15

Alfred Nobel provided in his will that, out of the income of his property, would be awarded every year, five prizes in five special subjects, viz. Literature, Chemistry, Physics, Medicine and Efforts in the Cause of World Peace. A sum of one hundred and twenty thousand rupees would be paid every year to each of five such men as would make the most material contributions to their subjects. Mr Nobel died in 1896 A.D. at the age of sixty-three and the (Nobel) prizes began to be awarded from 1901. So far the Europeans were the sole recipients of these prizes. It was our Rabinchranath who in 1913 was the first in India - nay in the whole of Asia - to win this distinction. But, instead of keeping the money to himself, he made a gift of the entire amount to his institution at Bolpur. Last year another Indian was honoured with the distinction. He was Sir Chandra Sekhar Raman, professor of Physics in the University of Calcutta.
