#### World Human Rights Day (HRD)



- Human Rights Day (HRD) is celebrated annually around the world on 10 December every year.
- The date was chosen to honor the United Nations General Assembly's adoption and proclamation, on 10 December 1948, of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR)
- The regulated theme to celebrate Human Rights Day 2023 is 'Freedom, Equality and Justice for All.'

#### Delegates from Thailand arrive in Siliguri

#### Context

- To connect North-East India to Thailand in the business sector, delegates from Thailand arrived in Siliguri.
- They communicated with the farmers, and producers and checked the products produced by them.
- This will establish a communication platform for business, especially for the small traders, farmers, people who make handicrafts, and handlooms, and people who belong to self-help groups.

#### RBU to soon open doors of gallery dedicated to Tagore's Italy visits

#### Context

- A permanent gallery dedicated to the **Nobel laureate** Rabindranath Tagore's visits to Italy will be unveiled at the Jorasanko Campus of Rabindra Bharati University (RBU)
- Tagore visited Italy thrice in 1878, 1925 and then again in 1926.
- There will be a display of photographs, Italian newspaper clippings, documents, and Tagore's handwritten messages.

# Phalut



- Phalut or Falut 3,600 metres (11,800 ft) is the second highest peak in West Bengal, India.
- Part of the Singalila Ridge in the Himalayas, it is located at the border of the Indian states of West Bengal and Sikkim and of Nepal.
- It is located inside the Singalila National Park.
- The indigenous tribes surrounding the mountain peak are known as Falutians by outsiders.
- Falutians have a 300-year history of worshipping the mountain peak and believe that Phalut is an omniscient god. They refer to the mountain peak as "Omna Re Ay".
