PM Rashtriya Bal Award	 Context Arijit Banerjee, a 13-year-old boy of Siliguri, received the Prime Minister Rashtriya Bal Award for Pakhawaj Vadan. He is the only person who has received this award in Bengal. Sand mining in Bengal	 Context The state government is expecting to get a revenue of Rs 1000 crore in the 2023-24 fiscal through the robust online mechanism of sand mining It was introduced by the Mamata Banerjee government in 2021. In July 2021, the state brought out a notification regarding the new 'Sand Mining Policy' to prevent damage to the riverine ecology and to take stringent action against black marketing and hoarding of sand. Sand Mining Policy in West Bengal follows a system wherein mining Ghats are e-auctioned by the State Government to private players. Mining lease is granted by the State to the Winning private bidder. The lease period for each sand Ghat is usually 5 (five) years. The winning plan against payment of one time-bid money, royalty and cess proportionate to the quantity of sand extracted.
Atrai river	 Context Atrai river is drying up because of construction of dams by the neighbouring country About Atrai River (also spelt as Atreyee) flows in West Bengal and northern parts of Bangladesh. In ancient times the river was called Atreyee and finds a mention in the Mahabharata, one of the two Sanskrit epics of ancient India. It is linked with Jorapani river, Fuleswari river, and Karatoya River. The Atrai originates in Siliguri ward no 40, near Baikanthapur forest of West Bengal and then after flowing through
