Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana



Context:

- Minister of State for Health Chandrima Bhattacharva revealed in the Assembly a concerning issue regarding PMMVY funding.
- The Centre has withheld Rs 2000 crore due to the state under PMMVY for the year 2023-24.
- State government bears 40%, Centre bears 60% of the scheme's cost.

About:

PMMVY is a maternity benefit program initiated by the Government of India in 2017.

Eligibility and Benefits

- Pregnant women aged 19 or above are eligible.
- Rs 5,000 provided for the first child.
- For the second child, Rs 5,000 is given if it's a girl.
- Includes pre- and post-pregnancy treatment, medicines, and testing facilities.
- The Centre has ceased providing its 25% share of funds for ICDS.
- State government now bears the entire cost, impacting salaries for supervisors and officials involved in food supervision.

Mamata Banerjee to Deliver Lecture at **Oxford University**


Context:

Bengal Farmers' Financial Landscape

Context:

- Farmers in **Bengal** take the least amount of loans compared to other states.
- The loan per farmer's family is 50.4 percent in comparison to states such as Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Punjab and Rajasthan where the loan per farmer's family in percentage is 93.2, 67.6, 69.9, 54, 54 and 65 percent respectively.

	State Government Agricultural Initiatives Bangla Shasya Bima (BSB)
	 Unique insurance scheme in Bengal covering preventive sowing. Provided substantial insurance coverage during the Kharif season. Over 98 lakh farmers have enrolled since inception. All 13 commercial crops, including potatoes, are covered under BSB. State government bears a 100% premium for all crops.
	 Comparison with Central Scheme The Central scheme (Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana) was not implemented in several states due to stringent terms. Bengal's BSB offers more flexible terms, leading to higher adoption.
King of the Jungle Arrives at Bengal Safari Park	Context: After much anticipation, the Bengal Safari Park in Siliguri welcomed the arrival of several new animals, including the "king of the jungle."
	 Key points: Animals, including a pair of lions, spectacled langurs, leopard cats, and black bucks, were transferred from the Sepahijala Zoological Park in Tripura to Bengal Safari Park. A green corridor was created for their safe passage as part of the animal exchange program facilitated by the Central Zoo Authority. Details:
	 The animals arrived at Bengal Safari Park, including a 7-year-old lion named Akbar and a 5-year-old lioness named Sita. Both lions were zoo-bred and had previously lived together, ensuring compatibility Bengal Safari Park has dedicated 20 hectares for a lion safari within its 297-hectare expanse. In exchange, Bengal Safari Park has sent a pair of Royal Bengal Tigers, leopards, and exotic birds to the Sepahijala Zoological Park in Tripura.
National Women's Day in India	Context: ■ In India, Sarojini Naidu's birth anniversary, on February 13, is marked as National Women's Day in honour of a woman who represented the spirit of female empowerment throughout her life and championed equality.
