National News

India May to Welcome Indonesia's President on Republic Day 2025

New Delhi is considering inviting Indonesia's newly elected President, Prabowo Subianto, as the chief guest for its Republic Day 2025 celebrations, according to sources. This potential invitation underscores a growing partnership between India and Indonesia, with plans for high-level meetings, defense cooperation, and possibly even the participation of the Indonesian military in the Republic Day parade.

NSE Launches Multilingual Mobile App and Website

On the occasion of Diwali and to mark its 30th anniversary, the National Stock Exchange of India (NSE) has launched its official mobile app, NSEIndia, and expanded its corporate website to support a total of 12 languages. This initiative aims to create a more inclusive financial ecosystem for millions of investors across India, allowing them to access market information in their preferred regional languages.

India Commits to 30% Protected Areas in Updated Biodiversity Plan

India has unveiled its updated National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (NBSAP) during the 16th UN Biodiversity Conference in Cali, Colombia, committing to protect at least 30% of its terrestrial, inland water, and coastal marine areas by 2030. This ambitious target aligns with the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (KM-GBF), adopted at the previous conference in 2022, which aims for global protection of 30% of land and ocean areas while restoring degraded ecosystems crucial for providing clean water and air.



EAM Jaishankar Inaugurates India's New Consulate in Brisbane

India's new consulate in Brisbane was inaugurated on 4th of November, 2024 by External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar, marking a milestone in strengthening India-Australia relations. Jaishankar highlighted the recent transformation in bilateral ties, driven by initiatives like a trade agreement that has opened up significant opportunities for both countries.

Union Minister Dr. Virendra Kumar Launches 'Shilp Samagam Mela 2024' and Unveils 'TULIP' Platform

The Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment inaugurated the 'Shilp Samagam Mela 2024' with a grand opening at Dilli Haat, New Delhi. Organized by key Corporations under the Ministry, including the National Scheduled Castes Finance and Development Corporation (NSFDC), National Backward Classes Finance and Development Corporation (NBCDFC), and National Safai Karmachari Finance and Development Corporation (NSKFDC).

Moldova's President Maia Sandu Wins Second Term Amid Russian Interference Claims

Moldova as pro-Western President Maia Sandu won a second term in a highly contested presidential runoff. With the country divided over its future alignment—whether closer to the European Union or maintaining ties with Russia—the election was marred by allegations of interference, vote-buying, and intimidation. Sandu's victory is seen as a decisive push toward Moldova's EU integration, but the result reflects deep-seated geopolitical tensions and internal divisions. Maia Sandu secured 55% of the vote against her Russia-aligned opponent, Alexandr Stoianoglo, who garnered 45%, according to Moldova's Central Electoral Commission (CEC). Sandu's victory comes as a relief for Moldova's pro-European government, which fully supported her re-election bid to accelerate Moldova's path toward European Union membership.

Switzerland's Burga Ban Law to Take Effect in 2025

Switzerland is set to enforce its controversial "burqa ban" starting January 1, 2025, following approval in a closely contested 2021 referendum. The law, which prohibits facial coverings in public spaces, has sparked significant debate and criticism, particularly from Muslim associations.

Zimbabwe Launches ZIMSAT-2 to **Advance Space Programme**

Zimbabwe has launched its second satellite, ZIMSAT-2, from the Vostochny Cosmodrome in Russia, a major milestone in the country's growing space programme. This satellite, equipped with a high-resolution multispectral camera, will aid in agriculture, resource exploration, environmental monitoring, and disaster management. It follows the successful launch of Zimbabwe's first satellite, ZIMSAT-1, in November 2022, marking continued progress in space technology and innovation.

President Murmu Witnesses Naval Operations Aboard **INS Vikrant**

Honorable President Droupadi Murmu embarked on her first visit to Indian Navy ships at sea aboard the indigenous aircraft carrier INS Vikrant on 7th November. During this significant event, she witnessed a series of advanced operational demonstrations, showcasing the Indian Navy's combat capabilities and maritime prowess.

Sitharaman Launches MSME Outreach, Expands SIDBI in Karnataka

Union Minister for Finance and Corporate Affairs, Nirmala Sitharaman, launched the National MSME Cluster Outreach Programme in Bengaluru, jointly organized by the Department of Financial Services (DFS), Ministry of Finance, and Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI). Key officials, including Shri Jitan Ram Manjhi, Union Minister for MSMEs (virtually from Gaya, Bihar), and other dignitaries were present. The programme linked around 150 MSME clusters virtually, emphasizing access to financial services and boosting MSME growth nationwide.

Kartarpur Sahib Corridor Celebrates 5 Years of Religious Connectivity

The Kartarpur Sahib Corridor, connecting India and Pakistan, marks its fifth anniversary today. The corridor leads to the Gurdwara Sri Kartarpur Sahib in Pakistan, where Guru Nanak Dev Ji spent the last 18 years of his life. The corridor was inaugurated by Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi on November 9, 2019, during the 550th Prakash Purb of Guru Nanak Dev Ji. Over the past five years, more than 3.4 lakh devotees have visited the site. The corridor is a significant step in religious diplomacy, allowing pilgrims from India to visit this sacred site without a visa. As of today, 417 pilgrims have traveled, the highest this year.

Justice DY Chandrachud Retires, Leaves Enduring Legacy in Judiciary

Chief Justice D.Y. Chandrachud concluded his tenure as the 50th Chief Justice of India on Sunday, after two years marked by groundbreaking rulings and significant reforms. His leadership has left a lasting impact on the Indian judiciary, shaping its future with transformative decisions and a focus on judicial independence, transparency, and accessibility.

Hindalco Tops Global Sustainability Rankings for 5th Year

Hindalco Industries Ltd., the metals arm of the Aditya Birla Group, has secured the top position as the world's most sustainable aluminium company for the fifth consecutive year, according to the 2024 S&P Global Corporate Sustainability Assessment (CSA) rankings. The company earned a total score of 87 points, improving by 9 points from 2023, and surpassed its closest competitor by 22 points. Hindalco's consistent efforts to raise its environmental, social, and governance (ESG) standards have played a pivotal role in this achievement.

MHA Greenlights CISF's First All-Women Unit

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has approved the creation of the Central Industrial Security Force's (CISF) first-ever all-women battalion, announced on 12th November, 2024. This historic move aims to promote gender equality and inspire more women to contribute to the CISF's mission of securing the nation's strategic assets.

Swami Vivekananda Vidya Mandir Opens in Silvassa, **Inaugurated by President**

President Droupadi Murmu inaugurated the Swami Vivekananda Vidya Mandir school at Zanda Chowk in Silvassa on 13th November. During her visit, she enjoyed lighthearted interactions with the students, joining them in games and reciting poems together.

Govt Invests in 12 Projects Under National Technical **Textiles Mission**

The government approved 12 research projects worth ₹13.3 crore on 12th November, under the National Technical Textiles Mission. This decision was made by the 10th Mission Steering Group, led by Union Textiles Minister Giriraj Singh.

First Bodoland Mohotsov to Be Inaugurated by PM in Delhi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the first-ever Bodoland Mohotsov on 15th November at 6:30 PM at the SAI Indira Gandhi Sports Complex in New Delhi. The two-day festival, which will be held on 15th and 16th November, will celebrate the rich culture and heritage of the Bodoland region. The Prime Minister will also address the gathering during the inauguration.

Sabarimala Pilgrimage Gets Dedicated Weather Service from IMD

For the first time, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has introduced a localized weather forecasting system for the Sabarimala pilgrimage, similar to those used for the Amarnath and Char Dham yatras. The IMD announced the installation of three rain gauges at key locations Sannidhanam, Pamba, and Nilakkal.

PM Modi to Unveil Projects on Birsa Munda's Birth Anniversary in Bihar

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Bihar on Friday to attend a function marking the 150th birth anniversary of Birsa Munda, a revered freedom fighter known as "bhagwan" by tribal communities of the Chhota Nagpur plateau. Modi will travel to a remote village in Jamui district, approximately 200 km from the state capital, to celebrate "Janjatiya Gaurav Divas".

External Affairs Minister Inaugurates Symbiosis Dubai Campus

On the occasion of the inauguration of Symbiosis International University's first international campus at Dubai Knowledge Park, External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar and UAE Minister Sheikh Nahyan bin Mubarak Al Nahyan highlighted the significance of the event for both nations, particularly in terms of education and bilateral relations.

PM Modi Inaugurates 1st Bodoland Mohotsav, Celebrating Peace and Progress

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the first-ever Bodoland Mohotsav in Delhi, a two-day event celebrating the language, literature, and culture of the Bodo community. The event underscores the significant progress achieved after the Bodo Peace Accord in 2020, marking the end of decades of conflict and violence. The festival aims to foster unity, promote the Bodo culture, and highlight the region's development under the current government's leadership.

US Returns \$10 Million Worth of Looted Antiques to India

In a major development, the United States has returned over 1,400 looted artifacts worth \$10 million to India as part of an ongoing initiative to repatriate stolen cultural items from South and Southeast Asia. Among the returned artifacts is a celestial dancer sandstone sculpture, which had been illegally smuggled from central India to London before being sold to a patron of the New York Metropolitan Museum of Art.

ALT EFF 2024 Film Festival Returns to Mumbai to Ignite Climate Conversations

The All Living Things Environmental Film Festival (ALT EFF) returns to Mumbai for its 2024 edition, running from November 22 to December 8 at Liberty Cinema. Since its inception in 2020, ALT EFF has become a significant platform for environmental storytelling, bringing global issues of sustainability and climate change to the forefront through cinema. The festival is expanding its reach, with screenings in over 70 cities across India, including villages, fostering a wider conversation on environmental challenges.

UN Lists Chhattisgarh's Bastar Village as Tourism Destination

The small village of Dhudmaras, located in Chhattisgarh's Bastar district, has been selected by the United Nations World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) for its Best Tourism Village Upgrade programme. This programme highlights villages with potential for sustainable tourism development and aims to enhance local tourism infrastructure, promote cultural heritage, and improve residents' quality of life.

HMJS Launches "Bhu-Neer" Portal for Groundwater Permits

Shri C.R. Paatil, the Hon'ble Minister of Jal Shakti, digitally launched the "Bhu-Neer" portal during the concluding ceremony of India Water Week 2024. The portal, developed by the Central Ground Water Authority (CGWA) in collaboration with the National Informatics Centre (NIC), aims to improve groundwater regulation in India. The initiative aligns with the Government's focus on transparency, efficiency, and sustainability in groundwater management.

From a young age, she has excelled in academics, pageantry, and cultural promotion, cementing her position as a role model for young aspirants.

Prasar Bharati Launches OTT Platform 'Waves'

Prasar Bharati, India's public broadcaster, has launched its own OTT platform 'Waves' at the 55th International Film Festival of India (IFFI). With a diverse content library, it aims to deliver a mix of nostalgic classics and contemporary programming, making it a hub for family-friendly entertainment. The platform is available on Android and iOS, offering content in over 12 languages and spanning multiple genres such as infotainment, gaming, education, shopping, and live events. This launch marks a significant step toward realizing the Digital India vision, especially for rural audiences, by bridging the digital divide.

PM Modi Gifts Kolhapur's Silofar Panchamrit Kalash to Nigerian President

Prime Minister Narendra Modi presented Nigerian President Bola Ahmed Tinubu with a Silofar Panchamrit Kalash, a stunning example of Kolhapur's traditional craftsmanship, during his visit to Nigeria. This marks a significant diplomatic gesture, highlighting India's rich cultural heritage and reinforcing the growing ties between India and Nigeria. The kalash, made of high-quality silver, features intricate engravings typical of Kolhapur's renowned metalwork, with designs that include floral motifs, deities, and traditional patterns. This gift reflects both India's artistic legacy and its commitment to cultural exchange with Africa.



India's First Constitution Museum Inaugurated at O.P. **Iindal University**

India's first Constitution Museum, inaugurated by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla on November 23, 2a024, at O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) in Sonipat, Haryana, aims to enhance public understanding of the Constitution. This initiative, launched alongside the National Convention on the Constitution of India, is a tribute to the architects of the Indian Constitution and a celebration of its 75-year journey since adoption.

Indian Army Chief Named Honorary General of Nepali

General Upendra Dwivedi, the Chief of Army Staff (COAS) of the Indian Army, was recently conferred with the title of Honorary General of the Nepal Army by the President of Nepal, Ramchandra Paudel. This honor reflects the deeprooted historical, cultural, and military ties between India and Nepal. The tradition of honorary generalship between the two nations highlights the strong, enduring friendship and strategic cooperation shared by their armies.

Govt Should Include Coking Coal in Critical Minerals List: NITI Aayog

The NITI Aayog has recommended adding coking coal to India's critical minerals list, emphasizing its importance in steel production and infrastructure development. This aligns with global trends, such as the European Union's declaration of coking coal as a critical raw material. India's heavy reliance on imports (85% of its coking coal) underscores the need to enhance domestic production.

The report "Enhancing Domestic Coking Coal Availability to Reduce the Import of Coking Coal" advocates for policy changes to leverage India's 16.5 billion tonnes of medium coking coal reserves and achieve self-reliance while adhering to Net Zero commitments by 2070.

Gwalior Unveils India's First Self-Sufficient Gaushala with a State-of-the-Art CBG Plant

In a groundbreaking initiative, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated India's first modern, self-sufficient gaushala in Laltipara, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh. The gaushala, named Adarsh Gaushala, houses a state-of-the-art Compressed Bio-Gas (CBG) plant, marking a major milestone in India's journey toward achieving sustainable development and promoting green energy solutions. This project reflects Modi's vision of turning "Waste to Wealth", highlighting how organic waste can be transformed into valuable resources.

Dr. Jitendra Singh Launches VISION Portal to Empower Underprivileged Youth

Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh inaugurated the VISION Portal (Viksit Bharat Initiative for Student Innovation and Outreach Network) on 21 November 2024 in New Delhi. Developed by the Utsav Foundation, a non-profit organization based in Gurugram, the portal aims to uplift underprivileged youth through education, skill development, and sustainable livelihoods. It bridges the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical experience by funding student internships and fostering innovation.

National Mission on Natural Farming: Advancing Sustainable Agriculture

The Government of India has launched the National Mission on Natural Farming (NMNF) with an allocation of ₹2,481 crore, aiming to promote natural farming across the nation. This scheme, approved by the Union Cabinet on November 25, 2024, will target 1 crore farmers and cover around 750,000 hectares of land over the next two years. The initiative integrates various past efforts, including the Bhartiya Prakratik Krishi Paddhati and Gobardhan Mission, to promote Zero Budget Natural Farming (ZBNF) and other locally adapted farming methods.

Cabinet Approves PAN 2.0: Digital Transformation of Taxpayer Services

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA), chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the PAN 2.0 Project, an upgrade of the current PAN/TAN system, with a financial outlay of ₹1,435 crore. The project aims to streamline and digitize the PAN services, enhancing taxpayer registration and service delivery. PAN 2.0 is a part of the government's Digital India vision, which focuses on improving the digital infrastructure and making the PAN a common identifier across various government systems.

ICAI Signs MoU with CBSE to Enhance Commerce-Based Skill Courses in BFSI Sector

The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) has signed a significant Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) to

promote commerce-based skill courses, particularly within the Banking, Financial Services, and Insurance (BFSI) sector. This collaboration aims to equip students with industry-aligned competencies to enhance their employability and career prospects in accountancy and finance, bridging the gap between academic learning and professional requirements.

It integrates advanced technology, including data analytics and potential AI applications, to train and build the capacity of railway staff while ensuring passenger safety. The app was launched after a successful pilot project in the Nagpur division, and it is being rolled out across various railway zones to create a more secure environment for travelers.

Centre Receives 28 Proposals from 23 States for New City Development

The Union Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs has received 28 proposals from 23 states for the development of new cities, as part of the central government's initiative to meet the growing demand for urban expansion. This marks a significant step in fulfilling the commitment made in February 2021 to develop eight new cities. The proposals are under scrutiny, with a focus on ensuring quality and adherence to eligibility criteria set by the 15th Finance Commission.

40 Tourism Projects to Revitalize Lesser-Known Destinations Across India

In a bid to promote sustainable tourism and balance tourist traffic, the Ministry of Tourism has approved 40 projects worth over Rs 3,295 crore, aimed at transforming lesser-known destinations into iconic sites. Spanning 23 states, these projects are expected to stimulate local economies and

enhance tourism infrastructure. This initiative is in line with the past efforts to reduce overcrowding at popular tourist spots by focusing on underdeveloped regions.

IIT Guwahati to Host Nation's Largest Science Festival

The India International Science Festival (IISF) 2024, India's largest science celebration, will take place at IIT Guwahati, Assam, from November 30 to December 3, 2024. Organized under the aegis of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), with the National Institute for Interdisciplinary Science and Technology (CSIR-NIIST) as the coordinating body, IISF promotes science-society engagement and interdisciplinary collaboration.

India Re-Elected to UN Peacebuilding Commission for 2025-2026

India has been re-elected to the United Nations Peacebuilding Commission (PBC) for the 2025-2026 term, reaffirming its pivotal role in international peace efforts. The announcement was made by India's Permanent Mission to the UN, highlighting the country's unwavering dedication to promoting global stability as a founding member and major contributor to UN peacekeeping. This accomplishment underscores India's ongoing engagement with the PBC since its establishment in 2005.

SC Collegium Recommends Justice Manmohan for Apex

The Supreme Court Collegium, led by Chief Justice of India (CJI) Sanjiv Khanna, has proposed the elevation of Delhi High Court Chief Justice Manmohan to the apex court. Justice Manmohan's recommendation comes at a time when the Supreme Court operates with 32 judges, two short of its sanctioned strength of 34, following the retirements of Justices DY Chandrachud and Hima Kohli. The five-member Collegium, which includes Justices BR Gavai, Surya Kant, Hrishikesh Roy, and AS Oka, recently convened to finalize the decision.

Ashtalakshmi Festival Starts December 6

The Ashtalakshmi Mahotsav 2024, a grand three-day cultural festival, will be held at Bharat Mandapam, Pragati Maidan, New Delhi, from December 6th to 8th, 2024. Organized by the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER) and managed by its CPSE, the North Eastern Handicrafts & Handlooms Development Corporation Limited (NEHHDC), the Mahotsav aims to showcase the vibrant cultural and economic potential of Northeast India. The mascot, Purvi, a young girl symbolizing all eight northeastern states, was introduced during the curtain-raiser event.

Kemi Badenoch: A Historic Rise as Conservative Party Leader and UK Opposition Chief

Kemi Badenoch, 44, made history on November 2 as the first Black woman to lead the UK's Conservative Party, succeeding Rishi Sunak, Britain's first British Indian party leader. Following Sunak's resignation after the Conservatives' electoral defeat in July, Badenoch won the leadership race, defeating former minister Robert Jenrick by securing 53,806 votes out of a turnout of 72.8% among Conservative Party members.

The NHRC, chaired by Kamal Uddin Ahmed, along with members Md Salim Reza, Aminul Islam, Kongjari Chowdhury, Biswajit Chanda, and Tania Haque, submitted resignation letters to the president, according to BDNews24.com.

Australia to Ban Social Media for Children Under 16

Australia is set to implement a significant move by banning social media access for children under 16, starting in November. This proposed ban targets platforms like Instagram and Facebook, which have been linked to various issues such as body image concerns, cyberbullying, and mental health challenges among the youth. While this ban doesn't block internet access, it aims to mitigate the harmful impact these platforms have on young minds. However, the question remains: Will this measure be effective in shielding kids from the digital world's dangers?

Mount Lewotobi Laki-laki Erupts, Ash Column Reaches 6.500 Meters

Mount Lewotobi Laki-laki in eastern Indonesia erupted on November 7, spewing a massive ash column over 6,500 meters high, as authorities ramped up warnings and evacuation efforts. The 1,584-meter volcano, located on Flores Island, has shown increasing volcanic activity since November 3, with eruptions causing fatalities and severe damage. Indonesia, situated on the Pacific Ring of Fire, is highly susceptible to volcanic eruptions, and Lewotobi's latest eruption serves as a stark reminder of the region's volatility.

Rare H5 Bird Flu Case Found in Canadian Patient in B.C, Canada

Canada has reported its first-ever presumptive human case of H5 bird flu, with British Columbia confirming the diagnosis. A teenager tested positive for avian influenza caused by the H5 influenza virus, marking a significant development in the country's efforts to monitor and manage the spread of avian diseases. The case was disclosed through an official statement on the province's website, with health authorities calling it a rare event.

Li Quanhai Re-Elected as World Sailing President for Second Term

At the World Sailing General Assembly held in Singapore on November 9, Li Quanhai was re-elected as president for a new four-year term. The only Chinese president of an Olympic International Federation, Li's re-election marks a significant achievement for both him and the sport. He received 55 votes, securing a decisive victory over his competitors, Rodion Luka (UKR) with 2 votes and Philippe Rogge (BEL) with 29 votes. Li's leadership has been central to the growth and stability of World Sailing in recent years, and his continued role signals the future direction of the sport globally.





Canada Cancels SDS Visa Program Ended for India and 13 Other Countries

The Government of Canada has officially announced the termination of its Student Direct Stream (SDS) program, which was widely popular among Indian students for expedited processing of study permits. Effective immediately, students from India and 13 other countries who previously benefited from faster application handling through the SDS will now have to apply through the regular study permit system.

Leadership Shift: Ramgoolam Set to become New PM of Mauritius

In a significant political shift, Mauritius' opposition appears poised for victory in the recent legislative elections, as Prime Minister Pravind Jugnauth conceded defeat on 11th November. Opposition leader Dr. Navin Ramgoolam is expected to assume the role of prime minister for the third time, leading his Alliance of Change coalition.

Alix Didier Fils-Aime Sworn in as Haiti's New Prime Minister

Businessman Alix Didier Fils-Aime has been sworn in as Haiti's new prime minister, vowing to address the country's critical security issues and restore stability. His predecessor, Garry Conille, was ousted just five months into office following a power struggle with Haiti's transitional council over ministerial appointments.

Trump Picks Elise Stefanik as U.N. Ambassador

President-elect Donald Trump has chosen Republican Rep. Elise Stefanik to serve as U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, marking his first Cabinet pick for his second term. Stefanik, a staunch defender of Israel and a key Trump ally, has been a prominent voice in Congress, especially on foreign policy and security issues. At 40, Stefanik's career has been marked by her vocal support for Trump and her leadership role within the GOP, making her an influential figure in both domestic and international politics.

Dominica to Award Its Highest National Honour to PM Modi

The Commonwealth of Dominica has announced that it will award Prime Minister Narendra Modi its highest national honour, the Dominica Award of Honour, in recognition of his significant contributions to the island nation, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic. This prestigious award will be presented to the Indian Prime Minister by Sylvanie Burton, the President of the Commonwealth of Dominica, during the upcoming India-CARICOM Summit in Georgetown,

Guyana. The summit is set to take place next week, and the award ceremony will be one of the key highlights of the event.

Australia Appoints First Anti-Slavery Commissioner to Combat Modern Slavery

In a landmark move, Australia has appointed its first Anti-Slavery Commissioner, Chris Evans, who will serve a five-year term starting in December 2024. The position is designed to strengthen efforts across the government, business, and society to combat modern slavery, which includes human trafficking, forced labour, and deceptive recruiting. The move is in line with the Albanese Government's commitment to address modern slavery, with a focus on victim support, raising awareness, and improving business accountability in supply chains.

China Unveils Megaport in Peru, but Locals Feel Left

China's \$1.3 billion megaport in Chancay, Peru, majority-owned by Chinese shipping giant Cosco, promises to connect South America to Asia and boost regional trade. However, locals in this coastal desert village, where many live without basic services, express dissatisfaction, claiming the port harms their livelihoods and brings no tangible benefits. While the government envisions significant economic growth, the residents of Chancay, particularly the fishermen, see the project as a threat to their resources and environment.

Tropical Storm Sara Hits Honduras, Threatens Floods in Central America and Mexico

Tropical Storm Sara made landfall in northern Honduras late Thursday, bringing heavy rain and the threat of lifethreatening flooding to parts of Central America and southern Mexico. The storm hit near Brus Laguna, Honduras, and is expected to continue its path west, impacting Belize and Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula. Forecasts predict up to 30 inches of rain in some areas, with winds of 45 mph (75 km/h) and slow movement at 10 mph (17 km/h).

Shanghai, Tokyo, New York, and Houston Leading Emitters of Greenhouse Gases

A new dataset released at the United Nations climate talks reveals that cities in Asia and the United States are the largest contributors to greenhouse gas emissions. Shanghai tops the list of polluting cities, followed closely by Tokyo, New York, and Houston. The data, compiled by Climate Trace using advanced observations and artificial intelligence, highlights the urgent need for global action to combat climate change.





From Congress to Intelligence Tulsi Gabbard's New Role for National Intelligence

Former Democratic Congresswoman Tulsi Gabbard was appointed as the Director of National Intelligence (DNI) by U.S. President-elect Donald Trump on November 13. Typhoon Man-yi Strikes Northern Philippines

Super Typhoon Man-yi, locally known as Pepito, has made a second landfall on the Philippines' main island of Luzon, bringing severe winds, torrential rains, and life-threatening storm surges. The powerful storm has caused widespread damage, particularly in Cantanduanes, where it uprooted trees, destroyed buildings, and disrupted power supplies.

Gabon Approves New Constitution in Historic Referendum

Gabon held a landmark referendum, where 91% of voters approved a new constitution, marking a significant political shift in the country. The constitution aims to end 55 years of dynastic rule and reintroduce a democratic civilian government. The ruling military junta, which took power in August 2023 through a coup, orchestrated the referendum, signaling a new era of governance.

Brazil Officially Hands Over G20 Presidency to South Africa

Brazil officially transferred the Group of 20 (G20) Presidency to South Africa during the closing ceremony of the annual G20 summit in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. This marks a historic milestone as South Africa becomes the first African nation to lead the G20, with a robust agenda planned for its presidency.

Iraq Conducts First National Census in 40 Years

Iraq is conducting its first nationwide census since 1987, under Saddam Hussein's regime, with a significant operation involving 120,000 researchers. This extensive demographic survey, scheduled over two days, will collect data from households across all 18 governorates of the country. To facilitate the process, the Ministry of Interior has imposed a two-day curfew.

Japan and Wales to Partner with Nagaland for Hornbill Festival 2024

Japan has been announced as the official partner country for the 25th edition of Nagaland's renowned Hornbill Festival, alongside Wales, which was confirmed earlier. This strategic partnership, forged through meetings between Nagaland's Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio and Japanese Embassy representatives, including Takashi Ariyoshi and Mayumi Tsubakimoto, marks a significant moment in the state's cultural calendar.

Kenya Cancels Airport and Energy Deals with Indian Tycoon Gautam Adani Amid U.S. Bribery Charges

Kenyan President William Ruto announced on November 21, 2024, the cancellation of multimillion-dollar deals with Indian business tycoon Gautam Adani, citing concerns over bribery and fraud allegations. The decision follows U.S. indictments against Adani, one of Asia's richest men, accusing him of securities fraud and a bribery scheme linked to a solar energy project in India.

This announcement comes amid mounting criticism and protests in Kenya, where Adani's deals were seen as controversial and potentially harmful to workers' rights and job security.

UK and India to Relaunch FTA Talks in Early 2025

UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer announced the resumption of Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations with India, set to restart in early 2025. This decision follows a meeting with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, where both leaders emphasized strengthening their strategic partnership, which covers key sectors such as security, defense, technology, climate, health, and education. The bilateral trade between the two countries stands at GBP 42 billion annually.

Bali Celebrates Hindu Festival of Gratitude

While proponents laud the move as essential for child safety, critics argue the legislation is rushed, may pose privacy risks, and could unintentionally harm vulnerable youth.

Jaishankar Opens Indian Embassy's New Chancery in Italy

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar inaugurated the new Chancery of the Indian Embassy in Rome, emphasizing the deep historical ties between India and Italy. He highlighted the maritime connections and the shared commitments to global issues such as freedom of navigation and maritime security. The inauguration reflects the expanding partnership between the two nations and aims to strengthen services for the Indian diaspora .

India-Sri Lanka Joint Operation Seizes 500 kg Crystal Meth

The Indian and Sri Lankan Navies successfully conducted a joint anti-narcotics operation in the Arabian Sea, intercepting two Sri Lankan-flagged fishing vessels and seizing approximately 500 kg of crystal methamphetamine on November 24-25, 2024. The operation was launched based on inputs from the Sri Lankan Navy, showcasing the growing synergy between the two nations in combating transnational crimes.

Uttar Pradesh Boosts Veterinary Services with New Policy

The Uttar Pradesh government has announced a new policy to enhance veterinary services by introducing diploma and certificate courses in animal husbandry and para-veterinary medicine. This innovative project will enable emission-free transport in the region, marking a significant milestone in India's efforts to embrace green mobility.

The station, designed to produce 80 kg of green hydrogen daily, supports NTPC's green mobility initiatives under the National Hydrogen Energy Mission. Inaugurated by Union Power Minister Manohar Lal, it will also aid in the operation of five hydrogen fuel cell buses in the region. The project is poised to play a key role in the development of hydrogen infrastructure across India.

Cybercrime Surge in Top States: Govt's 13-Pronged Strategy

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has revealed that Telangana, Karnataka, and Maharashtra have emerged as the top states registering the highest number of cybercrime cases in the last three years, with Telangana leading the pack. The Central Government has implemented a 13-pronged strategy to curb cybercrimes, aiming to strengthen the detection, investigation, and prosecution of these crimes. Between 2020 and 2022, Telangana recorded 30,596 cybercrime cases, Karnataka registered 31,433, and Maharashtra saw 19,307 incidents.

Cyclone Fengal to Cross TN-Puducherry Coast: IMD and ISRO on High Alert

The deep depression over the Southwest Bay of Bengal, likely to intensify into Cyclone Fengal, is set to make landfall between Karaikal and Mahabalipuram on November 30, bringing heavy rainfall and strong winds to Tamil Nadu and Puducherry. ISRO and IMD are actively monitoring the system, with ISRO satellites EOS-06 and INSAT-3DR providing real-time updates. IMD issued an orange alert for Kancheepuram, Chengalpattu, Villupuram, and Cuddalore, and a yellow alert for Chennai, Tiruvallur, and other districts. Heavy rains in the Cauvery delta region have already caused significant crop damage.

France to Feature Prominently at 30th Kolkata International Film Festival

The 30th edition of the Kolkata International Film Festival (KIFF) is set to showcase a diverse range of films from 41 countries, with a special emphasis on French cinema. Scheduled from December 4 to 11, 2024, the festival will feature 175 films, including contemporary works by French women filmmakers, classic French films, and a variety of international and Indian cinema. This year's festival promises a rich mix of screenings, interactive sessions, and seminars, including appearances from prominent figures like Vidya Balan and R Balki.

ICG Hosts 11th SAREX-2024 Off Kochi Coast

The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) conducted the 11th edition of the National Maritime Search and Rescue Exercise (SAREX-2024) off the Kochi coast, showcasing India's maritime safety capabilities. Inaugurated by Defence Secretary Rajesh Kumar Singh, the two-day event featured sea drills, workshops, and discussions aimed at enhancing regional search-and-rescue collaboration. The exercise aligns with India's SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region) vision, highlighting its role as a proactive maritime partner. It brought together key Indian agencies and 38 international observers, signaling India's.

Gujarat's Gharchola Handicraft Gets GI Recognition

Gujarat's iconic handicraft, 'Gharchola,' has been awarded the Geographical Indication (GI) tag by the Union government, taking the state's total GI tags to 27, with 23 dedicated to handicrafts. This recognition highlights the rich cultural heritage and exquisite craftsmanship of Gujarat's artisans. Presented during the "GI and Beyond – Virasat Se Vikas Tak" program in New Delhi, the accolade underscores the state's commitment to preserving and promoting its artistic traditions.





Economy News

Canara Bank Aims for ₹6,000 Crore Recovery in H2 FY25

State-owned Canara Bank is setting a significant target for loan recovery, aiming to recoup approximately ₹6,000 crore from bad loans in the second half of the current fiscal year (H2 FY25). This strategic goal reflects the bank's ongoing efforts to improve asset quality while building on its recent financial performance.

Cabinet Approves ₹10,700 Crore Equity Infusion for FCI

In a significant financial boost, the Union Cabinet approved an equity infusion of ₹10,700 crore for the Food Corporation of India (FCI) on Wednesday. This move is expected to reduce FCI's dependency on high-interest debt for funding its large-scale food distribution efforts. It aligns with the government's ongoing strategy to enhance food security and minimize subsidy burdens.

Govt Reconstitutes CAC to Strengthen Apprenticeship Training and Drive Industry Reforms

In a move to enhance apprenticeship programs across India, the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) has restructured the Central Apprenticeship Council (CAC), tasked with reforming existing rules and promoting industry adoption of on-the-job training. This reconstituted council, with a three-year mandate, is designed to bolster apprenticeship opportunities and encourage workforce development.

Supreme Court Overturns 1967 Ruling on AMU's Minority Status

In a historic 4-3 decision on November 8, 2024, the Supreme Court overturned its 1967 ruling in the Azeez Basha case, which had denied Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) minority institution status. This landmark judgment paves the way for AMU's minority status to be reassessed based on its historical, administrative, and founding context, under the protective framework of Article 30 of the Indian Constitution. While AMU's status remains undecided, the verdict has crucial implications for how educational institutions are recognized under constitutional provisions.

5th National EMRS Fest Celebrates Tribal Heritage & Samp; Birsa Munda's Legacy

The 5th National EMRS Cultural & Literary Fest and Kala Utsav, organized by the National Education Society for Tribal Students (NESTS), is taking place from 12th to 15th November 2024 in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, at Shiksha 'O' Anusandhan.

This event, hosted by the Odisha Model Tribal Educational Society (OMTES), marks a significant moment in honoring the 150th birth anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda. With the theme "A Tribute to Bhagwan Birsa Munda & Tribal Freedom Fighters," this event underscores the deep connection between India's tribal communities, their culture, and their history.

55th International Film Festival of India: A Celebration of Global Cinema in Goa

The International Film Festival of India (IFFI) is set to begin its 55th edition in Panaji, Goa. This annual event, which has become synonymous with cinematic excellence, is once again transforming Goa into a lively hub of global culture, talent, and cinema. For film enthusiasts, industry leaders, and aspiring filmmakers, IFFI offers a platform not only to showcase their films but also to experience a unique blend of artistic celebration and cultural exchange.

Amit Shah Greenlights Rs. 725.62 Crore for Fire Services Expansion

In a major step towards enhancing disaster resilience, Union Home Minister Amit Shah has approved three significant projects worth Rs. 725.62 crore under the "Expansion and Modernization of Fire Services in the States." These projects, aimed at bolstering fire safety infrastructure, will benefit Chhattisgarh (Rs. 147.76 crore), Odisha (Rs. 201.10 crore), and West Bengal (Rs. 376.76 crore). This approval comes as part of the government's broader effort to strengthen disaster management and response systems in line with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of a disaster-resilient India.

Deposit Growth Matches Credit Amid Lending Slowdown

In the fortnight ending November 1, 2024, deposit growth nearly matched credit growth, with credit increasing by 11.9% and deposits growing by 11.83% year-on-year (Y-o-Y), according to data released by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). This alignment comes after a period where credit growth consistently outpaced deposit growth since March 2022, driven by a significant widening gap that reached as high as 700 basis points. The shift reflects the impact of RBI's regulatory measures and the moderation of credit growth, especially in sectors like unsecured loans and non-banking financial companies (NBFCs).

Fastest Growing G20 Economy India's 7% GDP Growth Tops G20 Chart

India has emerged as the fastest-growing economy among G20 countries, with a projected GDP growth rate of 7% for 2024. This remarkable achievement highlights India's economic resilience and potential amidst global challenges.

The rankings, released during the ongoing G20 summit in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, underscore the disparity in growth rates among G20 nations and set the stage for discussions on sustainable development, global governance reforms, and strategies to combat poverty, hunger, and inequality.

India's Unemployment Rate Drops to 6.4% in Q2

In the July-September 2024 quarter, India's urban unemployment rate decreased to 6.4%, marking the lowest level observed in recent years. The rate has dropped from 6.6% in the previous quarter and remains consistent with the rate recorded in the same period last year. This improvement reflects positive trends in employment, particularly in urban areas, indicating progress in job creation and labor force participation.

Morgan Stanley Cuts India's FY25 Growth Forecast to 6.7%

Morgan Stanley has revised India's FY25 growth forecast from 7% to 6.7% due to weaker-than-expected economic data from Q2, with the economy now projected to grow at a slower 6.3%. Despite this downgrade, the firm remains optimistic about a recovery in the latter half of FY25, anticipating growth to rebound to around 6.7-6.8%, driven by agricultural output and government spending.

Zomato to Replace JSW Steel on BSE Sensex from December 23

On November 22, 2024, the Asia Index Private Ltd, a subsidiary of the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE), announced the latest reconstitution of the benchmark BSE Sensex index. As part of this rejig, Zomato, the online food delivery giant, will replace JSW Steel in the 30-stock index. This reshuffling will take effect from December 23, 2024 and includes changes in other indices such as the BSE 100, BSE Sensex 50, and BSE Sensex Next 50.



India's Forex Reserves See Sharpest Weekly Fall in Record, Hit 4-Month Low

India's foreign exchange reserves suffered their largest weekly drop on record, falling by \$17.76 billion to a fourmonth low of \$657.8 billion for the week ending November 15, 2024. This marks the sharpest decline since records began in 1998, surpassing the previous high of \$15.5 billion during the global financial crisis of October 2008. The primary causes for the fall include the strengthening of the US dollar, the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) intervention to protect the rupee, and declining gold prices.

S&P Global Revises India's GDP and Inflation Projections

S&P Global Ratings maintained India's GDP growth forecast for FY25 at 6.8% while revising FY26 down to 6.7% from the earlier estimate of 6.9%. The agency also raised its inflation projection for FY25 to 4.6%, reflecting persistent food inflation and supply shocks in agriculture caused by climate factors like changing rainfall patterns and heatwaves. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), mandated to keep inflation at $4\% \pm 2\%$, is expected to cut policy rates only once this fiscal year, with the repo rate held steady at 6.5% since February 2023.

GST Collection on Health and Life Insurance

The Union Government collected ₹16,398 crore as GST from health and life insurance services in FY24, reflecting a significant 680% increase from ₹2,101 crore in FY20. However, this marked a slight drop compared to ₹16,770 crore in FY23. Life insurance contributed ₹8,135 crore, while health insurance added ₹8,263 crore in FY24. Additionally, ₹2,045 crore was raised from reinsurance services, with ₹561 crore from life reinsurance and ₹1,484 crore from health reinsurance. Specific schemes like Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojana (RSBY) and Jan Arogya Bima Policy remain exempt from GST.

India Secures \$98 Million ADB Loan to Enhance Horticulture Health

India has secured a \$98 million loan from the Asian Development Bank (ADB) to enhance horticulture productivity by promoting plant health management. This initiative aligns with the Government of India's Atmanirbhar Clean Plant Programme (CPP) and aims to increase crop yields, improve quality, and build resilience against climate change.

Global AI Preparedness India's Position Among Leading Nations

Artificial intelligence (AI) is revolutionizing the global economy, reshaping labor markets, industries, and societal dynamics. This transformation brings vast opportunities along with complex challenges. According to a forecast by Grand View Research, the global AI market is expected to grow at a robust compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 36.6% from 2024 to 2030, highlighting AI's expanding role in various sectors.

This expansion raises concerns about the heightened risk of glacial lake outburst floods (GLOFs). The report, accessed by PTI from the Central Water Commission (CWC), highlights that lakes in India have seen an even more significant growth, with a surface area increase of 33.7%.

QS Asia Rankings 2025: India's Top 10 Universities and Their Growing Impact

The QS Asia Rankings 2025 recently unveiled by Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) reflect India's significant academic progress on a global scale. With 161 Indian universities included among the 984 ranked institutions across Asia, and six institutions making it to the top 100, this ranking affirms India's expanding influence in the academic landscape of Asia. In 2025, Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (IITD) leads among Indian institutions, achieving 44th place overall in Asia. Not far behind, IIT Bombay ranks at 48th, followed by IIT Madras at 56th. These institutes, along with others in the top 100, embody India's commitment to academic excellence, research, and global reputation.

Hurun India Philanthropy List 2024, Check Top 10 Philanthropists

The EdelGive-Hurun India Philanthropy List 2024 reveals an inspiring rise in philanthropic contributions across India. With over 200 philanthropists donating nearly ₹8,783 crore, this year's report reflects an increasing dedication among the nation's wealthiest individuals to drive social change. At the top of the list is Shiv Nadar, founder of HCL Technologies, who continues to be India's most generous philanthropist. For the third time in five years, Nadar has led in donations, contributing ₹2,153 crore in FY 2024—translating to an average of ₹5.9 crore per day.

ISA Launches World Solar Report Series

The 3rd edition of the World Solar Report series was launched at the 7th Assembly of the International Solar Alliance, spotlighting key areas in the global transition to sustainable energy. This year's release includes four reports: the World Solar Market Report, World Investment Report, World Technology Report, and Green Hydrogen Readiness Assessment for African Countries.

India's Historic Rise: Ranked 6th Globally in WIPO Patent Filings 2023

India has made remarkable progress in intellectual property (IP) filings, securing 6th place globally for the first time in 2023, according to the World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO) Global Patent Filing Report. This achievement reflects a robust growth of 15.7% in patent filings, marking the fifth consecutive year of double-digit growth in India. With more than 64,480 patents filed in 2023, India's contributions are now among the top 10 nations globally across major IP rights, including patents, trademarks, and industrial designs.

London Leads Global City Brands Rankings Again

London has topped the list of the world's top 100 "city brands" for the second consecutive year, according to Brand Finance's Global City Index. The ranking, released on Thursday, was based on a survey of 15,000 people across 20 countries, including Türkiye, the US, Germany, Australia, the UAE, Brazil, China, and others.

India Drops Two Spots in Global Climate Index

India has maintained its position as one of the top 10 performers in the Climate Change Performance Index (CCPI) 2025, despite slipping two spots compared to last year. The report highlights India's commendable efforts in reducing per-capita emissions and its accelerated adoption of renewable energy. Published by Germanwatch, New Climate Institute, and Climate Action Network International, the CCPI assesses 63 countries and the European Union, which collectively contribute to 90% of global emissions.

World Bank Launches 'Jobs at Your Doorstep' Report in Delhi

The Union Minister for Education, Dharmendra Pradhan, along with Minister of Labour and Employment, Youth Affairs and Sports Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, launched the World Bank's report titled Jobs at Your Doorstep: A Jobs Diagnostics for Young People in Six States in New Delhi on November 22, 2024. The report focuses on bridging skill gaps in young people and aligning school curricula with industry needs.

NTPC and ONGC Drive India's Green Energy Future with New Joint Venture

NTPC Limited and Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC), two Maharatna public sector giants, have officially launched a 50:50 Joint Venture Company (JVC) through their green energy subsidiaries – NTPC Green Energy Ltd. (NGEL) and ONGC Green Energy Ltd. (OGL). This collaboration, formalized after receiving approvals from DIPAM and NITI Aayog, marks a significant step in accelerating India's renewable and new energy goals. The companies have now applied to the Ministry of Corporate Affairs to establish the JVC, following the signing of their joint agreement during India Energy Week in February 2024.

BEML Recognized with 'Self-Certification' Honor

BEML Limited has been awarded the prestigious "Self-Certification" status for its defense equipment by the Department of Defence Production (DDP) of the Government of India. The certification was presented by RA Govardhana, ADGQA (V&EE), HQ DQAV, to Shantanu Roy, the Chairman and Managing Director of BEML Ltd., during a special event held at the company's headquarters.

Royal Enfield Launches EV Brand "Flying Flea"

Royal Enfield has recently unveiled its highly anticipated electric vehicle (EV) brand, "Flying Flea", an homage to one of the brand's most iconic models. The original Flying Flea was a compact, lightweight motorcycle designed in the 1940s for military use during World War II. Engineered to be air-dropped behind enemy lines, the bike was valued for its nimble handling and ability to navigate rugged terrains. Its unique design and military legacy eventually paved the way for a civilian model that remains popular among enthusiasts today.

IFC Invests \$400 Million in Bajaj Finance for Climate and Women Empowerment

The International Finance Corporation (IFC) has announced a strategic partnership with Bajaj Finance Ltd. (BFL), committing \$400 million as part of a \$1 billion fundraising initiative to enhance access to climate finance in India. Moody's Optimistic About India's Economic Growth Despite Volatility

Moody's Ratings has projected steady growth for India, maintaining its forecast of 7.2% GDP growth for 2024, despite some signs of slowdown in urban demand and mixed corporate results in Q2. The global rating agency highlighted positive economic indicators, including strong household consumption, increased rural demand, robust investment, and manufacturing activity. These factors, combined with government infrastructure spending and rising capacity utilization, support the outlook for the country's economy.

Galaxy Health Insurance Launches 'Galaxy Promise' to Tackle Rising Healthcare Costs

Galaxy Health Insurance has launched its first product, 'Galaxy Promise', offering comprehensive family health coverage with flexible sum insured options ranging from Rs 3 lakh to Rs 1 crore. Tata Acquires Majority Stake in Pegatron's iPhone Plant in Tamil Nadu

Tata Electronics has secured a deal to acquire a 60% stake in Pegatron's only iPhone plant in India, located in Tamil Nadu. This partnership strengthens Tata's position as a major Apple supplier and marks a significant shift in the geopolitical supply chain dynamics, with India becoming a key hub for iPhone manufacturing. The joint venture will involve Tata handling day-to-day operations, while Pegatron provides technical support. The plant, which employs around 10,000 people, currently produces 5 million iPhones annually. This acquisition places Tata at the forefront of Apple's efforts to diversify its manufacturing away from China.

Meta Fined ₹213.14 Crore Over WhatsApp Privacy **Policy: Challenges Loom**

Meta has announced its intention to appeal a ₹213.14 crore fine imposed by the Competition Commission of India (CCI) regarding its 2021 WhatsApp privacy policy update. CCI accuses the company of anti-competitive practices, including forcing users to accept new data-sharing terms, which Meta denies. The ruling could have significant implications for digital platforms balancing user privacy, competition, and business growth in India.

Alphabet Gets CCI Nod to Invest in Flipkart

The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has granted approval to Alphabet Inc.'s subsidiary, Shoreline International Holdings LLC, to acquire a stake in Walmartowned Flipkart Pvt Ltd. This follows Flipkart's May 2024 funding round, where Alphabet's Google invested \$350 million out of a total \$1 billion raised. Walmart, which holds an 85% stake in Flipkart, contributed \$600 million. Separately, CCI has also approved MUFG Bank Ltd.'s acquisition of an additional stake in Delhi-based digital lender DMI Finance, raising MUFG's shareholding to 20%.

Piyush Goyal Launches Ease of Doing Business Portal

Union Commerce and Industry Minister Shri Piyush Goyal inaugurated the (Confederation of Indian Industry) CII Ease of Doing Business (EoDB) and Regulatory Affairs Portal at the 2nd DPIIT-CII National Conference on Ease of Doing Business in New Delhi. The portal aims to provide real-time updates on government and CII initiatives to enhance business efficiency, ensure transparency, and foster accountability. It features a dedicated member dashboard for tracking suggestions and progress, reflecting a commitment to transforming India's business ecosystem.

CDS Gen Chauhan Signs Key Defense Pact with Algeria

India and Algeria have formalized their commitment to strengthening bilateral defense ties with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on defense cooperation. The agreement was signed by Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) General Anil Chauhan and Said Chanegriha, the Chief of Staff of the Algerian People's National Army. This significant development occurred during Gen. Chauhan's official visit to Algeria from October 31 to November 3.

Cairn Joins UNEP's OGMP 2.0 as India's First Oil & Gas **Pioneer**

Cairn Oil & Gas, a part of Vedanta Group, has become the first oil and gas producer in India to join the United Nations Environment Programme's Oil & Gas Methane Partnership (OGMP) 2.0. By signing this agreement, Cairn committed to reducing methane emissions effectively, marking a significant step towards environmental sustainability in the oil and gas sector.

IREL and Kazakhstan's UKTMP Collaborate for Titanium Slag JV in Odisha

RBI Designates 10-Year Sovereign Green Bonds Under FAR for Non-Resident Investments

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has expanded the list of Government securities available for non-resident investment under the Fully Accessible Route (FAR) by designating 10-year Sovereign Green Bonds (SGrBs) as 'specified securities.' These bonds will be issued by the government in the second half of the fiscal year 2024-25, aligning with the increasing global inclusion of Indian Government Securities (G-Secs) in international bond indices, such as JPMorgan Chase's GBI-EM GD index, Bloomberg EM Local Currency Government indices, and FTSE Russell's EMGBI.

RBI's New Framework for Converting FPI Holdings to FDI

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has introduced a new framework that allows Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) to convert their investments into Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) if their holdings exceed the 10% equity threshold in Indian companies. This move is designed to streamline the process, making it easier for FPIs to align with FDI guidelines, provided they have the necessary government and company approvals. The new rules, effective from November 11, 2024, offer FPIs the option to reclassify excess shares within five trading days, ensuring compliance with the Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA) and sectoral FDI caps.

SBI Seeks \$1.25 Billion in 2024's Largest Dollar-Denominated Loan

State Bank of India (SBI) is aiming to secure a \$1.25 billion five-year loan, which would be the largest dollar-denominated loan from India's financial sector in 2024. The loan, arranged by CTBC Bank, HSBC, and Taipei Fubon Bank, will be used for general corporate purposes. SBI's move follows a trend of increasing foreign currency borrowing by Indian financial institutions, particularly non-banking finance companies (NBFCs), due to stricter domestic regulations. Despite the rising demand, India's total dollar-denominated loan volume has decreased by 27% this year.

Bima Sugam: A Step Towards a Digital Insurance Ecosystem

The growing concern over mis-selling of insurance products by banks has prompted the introduction of the Bima Sugam platform, a digital initiative by the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI). IRDAI Chairman Debasish Panda, addressing the issue at SBI's Annual Business & Economic Conclave, emphasized that banks should prioritize their core lending activities and ensure customers are not coerced into buying unsuitable insurance products.

SEBI Abolishes 1% Security Deposit Mandate for Public Issues

In a significant move to enhance ease of doing business, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has abolished the requirement for issuer companies to deposit 1% of the issue size with stock exchanges before launching public issues of equity shares.

Previously, the 1% security deposit acted as a safeguard for resolving investor complaints post-issue, but SEBI's circular underscores the redundancy of this requirement due to the evolving regulatory framework.

The Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) has granted approval for the ₹10,000-crore acquisition of Reliance Capital Ltd (RCAP) by IndusInd International Holdings Ltd (IIHL), a Hinduja Group-backed firm. This marks a significant development in the resolution of the debt-ridden Reliance Capital, which had accumulated liabilities exceeding ₹40,000 crore. The deal, which has passed through the necessary regulatory clearances, paves the way for the finalization of the acquisition, resolving one of the key challenges facing the troubled financial entity.

RBI Doubles UPI 123Pay Limit to ₹10,000 for Feature Phones

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has raised the transaction limit for UPI 123Pay from ₹5,000 to ₹10,000, enhancing its utility for India's 400 million feature phone users. Launched in March 2022, UPI 123Pay enables digital transactions without internet access through IVR, missed calls, and sound-based payments. Alongside, the UPI Lite wallet limit has been increased from ₹2,000 to ₹5,000 to facilitate small-value transactions. These moves aim to deepen financial inclusion and boost the adoption of digital payments, particularly among underserved populations.

PNB Joins PCAF, Strengthens Climate Action Commitments

Punjab National Bank (PNB), India's second-largest public sector bank, has become a signatory of the Partnership for Carbon Accounting Financials (PCAF), marking a major step in its climate action journey. ISRO Begins Groundbreaking Analogue Space Mission in Leh

ISRO announced the launch of its analogue space mission in Leh, Ladakh. This innovative mission aims to simulate life in an interplanetary habitat, addressing the challenges associated with establishing a base station beyond Earth. Through this initiative, ISRO seeks to gather insights and prepare for future space exploration endeavors.





ISRO to Launch EU's Proba-3 Satellite in December, Aims for Bold Space Milestones

In a significant advancement for India's space sector, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is set to launch the European Union's Proba-3 Solar Observation Mission in December from Sriharikota. The satellite, arriving at Sriharikota, is designed to study the Sun's faint corona, a crucial aspect of solar science. This marks India's third collaboration with the EU in space, following the earlier launches of Proba-1 and Proba-2.

World's First Wooden Satellite, LignoSat

Japanese scientists launched the world's first wooden satellite, named LignoSat, marking a pioneering experiment in sustainable space technology. Developed by Kyoto University in collaboration with Sumitomo Forestry, this satellite aims to explore the potential of timber as a material for future space habitation and structures. The innovative project, which uses honoki wood, is designed to test the resilience of wood in the extreme conditions of space, possibly paving the way for long-term human settlements in space with renewable resources.

New Fire-Resilient, Dual-Blooming Plant Species Discovered in Western Ghats

In a groundbreaking discovery, scientists have identified a new fire-resilient species of Dicliptera in the Northern Western Ghats of India, named Dicliptera polymorpha. This new species is notable for its ability to thrive in harsh, fire-prone grasslands and its rare dual-blooming behavior, making it a significant addition to the biodiversity of the region. The discovery was made by a team from the Agharkar Research Institute (ARI), Pune, led by Dr. Mandar Datar, with the support of local botanist Adittya Dharap and Ph.D. student Bhushan Shigwan. The species was found in Talegaon-Dabhade, an area known for its grasslands and fodder markets.

IIT Madras, ISRO Collaborate on Spacecraft Thermal Research Centre

The Indian Institute of Technology Madras (IIT Madras) is teaming up with the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) to create a Centre of Excellence focused on research in 'Fluid and Thermal Sciences'. ISRO will provide seed funding of Rs 1.84 Crore to establish this center, which aims to advance research in these critical areas for space exploration.

NASA Partners with Microsoft to Simplify Access to Earth Science Data

NASA and Microsoft have collaborated to create "Earth Copilot," an AI-driven chatbot aimed at democratizing access to complex Earth Science data. Earth Copilot leverages Microsoft's Azure cloud and advanced AI capabilities to make NASA's extensive geospatial data repository accessible to a broader audience. Traditionally complex and requiring expert knowledge, this data can now be retrieved using simple, plain-language queries, such as assessing the impact of hurricanes or monitoring climate change effects.

SpaceX to Launch India's Communication Satellite GSAT-20

India's heavy communication satellite GSAT-20, weighing 4,700 kg, will be launched from Cape Canaveral, USA, by Elon Musk's SpaceX on November 19, 2024. The satellite, developed by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), will provide essential communication services, including internet connectivity to remote areas. This marks a significant milestone in India's space endeavors, as the satellite is too heavy for India's own launch vehicle, the LVM-3 "Bahubali".

ISRO's GSAT-N2 Communication Satellite Deployed by SpaceX

On November 18, 2024, SpaceX successfully launched the Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) GSAT-N2 communication satellite from Canaveral Space Force Station in Florida. This advanced satellite, designed to enhance broadband connectivity and support India's Smart Cities Mission, was carried aboard SpaceX's Falcon 9 rocket. Marking the first commercial collaboration between ISRO and SpaceX, the launch demonstrates India's growing reliance on international partnerships to achieve its ambitious space and technological objectives.

IISc Introduces STRONG for Nanopore Research

Researchers from the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) have introduced a groundbreaking language called STRONG (STring Representation Of Nanopore Geometry), which encodes the shape and structure of nanopores. This new tool is set to revolutionize nanopore research by enabling machine learning (ML) models to predict their properties accurately. This pioneering mission will study the Sun's corona, the outermost and hottest layer of the Sun's atmosphere, through an artificial solar eclipse created by two satellites flying in precise formation. Proba-3 represents a significant technological breakthrough and an example of international collaboration in space exploration.

India's First Space AI Lab: TM2Space's MOI-TD Revolution

Hyderabad-based space tech company TakeMe2Space (TM2Space) is set to launch MOI-TD (My Orbital Infrastructure – Technology Demonstrator), India's first AI laboratory in space, aboard ISRO's PSLV C60 rocket in mid-December 2024. This mission will enable real-time in-orbit data processing, drastically reducing data transmission costs and opening space research to a broader audience. TM2Space, known for its advancements in nano-satellites, aims to democratize space technology and accelerate India's role in cutting-edge space innovation.

Andhra Pradesh CM Launches Deepam 2.0 Scheme for Women

Announced by India's G-20 Sherpa, Amitabh Kant, on BRIC's 1st foundation day at the National Institute of Immunology (NII) on November 9, 2024, the initiative aims to showcase the critical role of unique bacterial species in India's environment, agriculture, and human health. This project will leverage genome sequencing to explore and unlock the microbial world's immense potential for various advancements.

Cabinet Approves 'One Nation One Subscription' Scheme

The Union Cabinet, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) scheme, allocating ₹6,000 crore for 2025-2027. This initiative aims to provide seamless access to high-impact scholarly articles and journals for nearly 1.8 crore students, faculty, and researchers across 6,300 government-managed higher education and R&D institutions. As apex predators in the Americas, jaguars (scientifically known as Panthera onca) are vital to maintaining ecological balance. However, their survival is increasingly threatened, making this day an important occasion for action and advocacy.

India Submits Formal Bid for 2036 Olympics

India has officially submitted a Letter of Intent to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) for the 2036 Olympic and Paralympic Games, marking a significant step in realizing Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of hosting the prestigious event. The bid was submitted by the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) on October 1, 2023, as part of the ongoing effort to elevate India's global sporting profile. 
4th LG Cup Horse Polo-2024 Tournament Inaugurated in Ladakh
