It is one of the eight hotspots of biological diversity in the world due to its high level of biological diversity and endemism.
Leptospirosis	 Why in news? Recently, two migrant workers have been admitted to a government hospital in Bhavani in Erode district with symptoms of leptospirosis (rat fever).

Key Points:

	 Leptospirosis, also known as "rat fever", is a rare bacterial infection that affects people and animals. The disease is caused by a bacterium called Leptospira interrogans, or Leptospira. It is most common in tropical areas and warmer climates with lots of rainfall each year. Transmission: The carriers of the disease can be either wild or domestic animals, including rodents, cattle, pigs, and dogs. Treatment: It can be treated with antibiotics, including penicillin and doxycycline.
Places in news: Trichy	Why in news? • Tamil Nadu's first shelter for stray dogs inaugurated in Trichy.
