**Kerala forms Organic Farming Mission to boost agriculture**



**Context**

The Kerala government has created an **Organic Farming Mission** to encourage the adoption of sustainable organic and climate-smart farming practices in the State.

**Key points**

- The mission aims at **expanding organic farming to 5,000 hectares** in the next five years through an annual target of 1,000 ha.
- In farms run by the Agriculture Department, at least **10% of the area** will be set aside for organic farming.
- **Mandate of the mission** is to make sure that selected beneficiaries/farms of organic farming schemes pursue the system at least for five years.
- The mission will take steps to expand the system for certification, branding, and marketing of organic agricultural products from Kerala.
- The mission will also focus on **value addition of organic products**.

**U.S. to invest \$553 mn. in Adani's Sri Lanka port terminal project**

**Context**

The U.S. **International Development Finance Corporation (DFC)** has agreed to invest \$553 million in the Adani Ports-led container terminal project in Colombo.

**Key points**

- The DFC seeks to **drive private-sector investments** that advance development and economic growth while strengthening the strategic positions of our partners
- Adani Ports signed a **\$700-million deal** with the Sri Lanka Ports Authority (SLPA) and Sri Lankan conglomerate John Keells Holdings in September 2021 to jointly develop the terminal.

**WHO hailed India's success in managing TB**

**Context**

According to World Health Organization's (WHO) **'Global TB Report 2023'**, India has made tremendous progress in improving case detection and reversed

the impact of COVID-19 on the tuberculosis (TB) programme.

### Key facts

- TB treatment coverage, according to the report, has also improved to 80% of the estimated TB cases, **an increase of 19% over the previous year.**
- India's efforts have resulted in the reduction of TB incidence by **16% from 2015 to 2022**, almost double the pace at which global TB incidence is declining (which is 8.7%).
- TB mortality has also **reduced by 18%** during the same period in India, and globally.

**GLOBAL TUBERCULOSIS REPORT 2023**

**TB SITUATION AND RESPONSE**  
Tuberculosis (TB) is contagious and airborne. In 2022, TB was the second leading infectious disease killer worldwide, after COVID-19. It was also the leading killer of people with HIV and a major cause of deaths related to antimicrobial resistance.

**TB BURDEN**

- In 2022, an estimated 10.6 million (95% uncertainty interval [UI] 9.9-11.4 million) people fell ill with TB worldwide, of which 5.8 million were men, 3.5 million were women and 1.3 million were children. People living with HIV accounted for 8.3% of the total.
- The TB incidence rate (new cases per 100 000 population per year) rose by 3.9% between 2020 and 2022, reversing declines of about 2% per year for most of the past 2 decades.
- Globally in 2022, TB caused an estimated 1.30 million (95% UI: 1.18-1.43 million) deaths, including 167 000 people with HIV. This was down from best estimates of 1.4 million in both 2020 and 2021 and almost back to the level of 2018.
- Eight countries accounted for more than two-thirds of the global total: India, Indonesia, China, the Philippines, Pakistan, Nigeria, Bangladesh and the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

**TB CARE AND TREATMENT**

- Global efforts to combat TB have saved an estimated 75 million lives since the year 2000.
- Globally in 2022, the reported number of people newly diagnosed with TB was 7.5 million. This is the highest number since WHO began global TB monitoring in 1995, above the pre-COVID baseline (and previous historical peak) of 7.1 million in 2019, and up from 5.8 million in 2020 and 6.4 million in 2021.
- The cumulative number of people treated between 2018 and 2022 was 34 million, equivalent to 84% of the 5-year (2018-2022) UN high-level meeting TB target of 40 million. This included 2.5 million children, 79% of the 5-year target of 3.5 million.
- There is still a large global gap between the estimated number of people who fell ill with TB and the number of people newly diagnosed, with approximately 2.1 million people not diagnosed with the disease, or not officially reported to national authorities in 2022, down from around 4 million in both 2020 and 2021, and back to the pre-pandemic level of 2019.

**DRUG-RESISTANT TB**

- Globally, an estimated 410 000 people (95% UI: 370 000-450 000) developed multidrug-resistant or rifampicin-resistant TB (MDR/RR-TB) in 2022.
- The number of people diagnosed and started on treatment was much lower: 176 650 people in 2022, equivalent to about two in five of those in need and still below the pre-pandemic level of 181 533 people in 2019.
- The treatment success rate for drug-resistant TB was 62% globally.

**ADDRESSING THE CO-EPIDEMICS OF TB AND HIV**

- Among all incident cases of TB in 2022, 8.3% were people living with HIV; this proportion has been steadily declining for several years. In 2022, 671 000 people living with HIV fell ill with TB, with the highest burden in countries in the WHO African Region.
- The global coverage of HIV testing among people diagnosed with TB remained high in 2022, at 80%. The global coverage of antiretroviral therapy for people living with HIV who were newly diagnosed and reported with TB was 85% in 2022.
