The Tenth Schedule of the Indian Constitution

- It was introduced in 1985 through the 52nd Amendment Act
- The law defines the conditions under which a member of Parliament or a state legislature can be disqualified for defecting from their political party.

Key provisions:

- 1. Disqualification on grounds of defection:
- A member can be disqualified if they voluntarily give up the membership of their party or vote against the party's directives on a motion of confidence or no-confidence.
- 2. Adjudication:
- The Speaker of the respective House decides on defection cases, and their decision is final.
- The Anti-Defection Law has been instrumental in reducing political instability and promoting party discipline in India.






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Telangana State Industrial Policy 2023

Sheep Distribution Scheme

Eligibility:

 The SDS is open to eligible beneficiaries from the shepherd community, primarily Yadavas and Kurumas, who are permanent residents of Telangana and possess land suitable for sheep rearing.







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
Pochampally Ikat



Context:

- Pochampally lkat is a traditional form of weaving from the town of Pochampally in Telangana, India.
- It is characterized by its intricate geometric patterns, which are created by a **resist-dyeing technique called ikat**.
- The ikat technique involves tying and dyeing the threads before they are woven, which results in a pattern that is blurred and indistinct.
- Pochampally Ikat is typically made from cotton or silk, and it is often used to make sarees, dupattas, and other traditional Indian garments.
- In 2005, Pochampally lkat was registered as a Geographical Indication (GI) product.





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
