Defence Ministry gives nod to elevated corridors proposed on defence lands	The Defence Ministry has cleared the construction of elevated corridors on specific defence lands in Hyderabad. This decision follows a request from the state government and paves the way for improved infrastructure in the city. - Mana Yatri is part of the Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC) network.
- The app launch was supported by the Telangana government and its tech hub incubator, T-Hub.

Key features of Mana Yatri:

- Zero commission for drivers: empowers drivers and offers potentially lower fares for passengers.
- Focus on first and last-mile connectivity: Aims to improve connections with public transport.
- Enhanced experience: Offers user features like improved pickup options in specific zones.











Telangana rejoins PMFBY to provide crop insurance to farmers

Context:

- The **Telangana government** has decided to rejoin the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) scheme, aiming to provide financial security to farmers in case of crop losses due to natural calamities.
