The Archaeological Discoveries of Phanigiri	Context:  Archaeologists conducting excavations in Nalgonda district have uncovered significant findings dating back 2,000 years.  The excavations at Phanigiri in Tirumalagiri mandal yielded 3,700 lead coins believed to have been used during the Buddhist period.  Additionally, in 2015, the Archaeology Department unearthed 2,000-year-old Buddhist remains in Phanigiri village.  Key findings:  Phanigiri is recognized as a prominent hub of Buddhist learning from the 3rd century BCE to the 3rd century CE.  The site features a Buddhist stupa, vihara, and chaityas spread across 16 acres on the hill.  Remarkably, Phanigiri boasts a higher number of Ikshvaku sculptures than any other archaeological site in Telangana, with each stone piece considered a masterpiece.  Among the discoveries, archaeologists found the only standing stucco statue of Bodhisattva in South India at Phanigiri.  The site's significance prompted initial excavations in 1941 by the Nizam government, revealing Buddhist evidence.  Subsequent excavations were conducted from 2001 to 2007 and again in 2018-19, culminating in the latest findings on March 31, 2024, which included coins, toranas, inscriptions, articles, coins, and inscribed pillars.

Telangana gets seven new Cyber Crime Police Stations	<ul> <li>Telangana has established seven new Cyber Crime Police Stations (CCPS) to combat the rising tide of cybercrime in the state.</li> <li>These stations will be operational starting April 2nd, 2024.</li> <li>Six of the new stations are located within the commissionerate limits of Nizamabad, Ramagundam, Karimnagar, Warangal, Khammam, and Siddipet.</li> <li>These stations will handle cybercrime cases involving financial losses of Rs 1 lakh and above.</li> <li>For cases with lower losses, residents can report to their local police stations.</li> <li>The seventh station, situated at the Telangana State Cyber Security Bureau (TSCSB) headquarters in Hyderabad, has statewide jurisdiction.</li> <li>It will address complex cybercrimes impacting national security or involving international connections, alongside cases referred by the state government or police officials.</li> </ul>
