Renewable energy	 Why in news? Telangana aims to add 40,000 MW additional energy capacity through renewable sources by 2035.
	 Key Points: Renewable energy comes from unlimited, naturally replenished resources, such as the sun, tides, and wind. Renewable energy can be used for electricity generation, space and water heating and cooling, and transportation.
Places in news: Bangarupalli hamlet	 Why in news? Telangana's first container school was inaugurated in the remote forest area of Mulugu district.
	 Key Points: This marks the first instance of a government school being established in a container in the State, aimed at addressing the infrastructural challenges faced by educational institutions in forest regions. The container school is a solution to overcome restrictions on construction of brick and mortar structures.
SC subclassification	 Why in news? The Cabinet sub-committee formed by the state government to review SC subclassification will study its implementation in Punjab, Haryana, and Tamil Nadu with input from legal experts. It ensures that the process of sub-classification would withstand judicial review while ensuring that injustice is not done to other communities.
	 Key Points: The Supreme Court has ruled that the 'creamy layer' principle, previously applied only to Other Backward Classes (OBCs) (as highlighted in Indra Sawhney Case), should now also be applied to SCs and STs. This means states must identify and exclude the creamy layer within SCs and STs from reservation benefits

unveiled the statue of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi opposite to the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Telangana State Secretariat.

Key Points:

- Rajiv Gandhi was an Indian politician who was Prime Minister of India from 1984 to 1989.
- He took office after the assassination of his mother, then-prime minister Indira Gandhi, to become at the age of 40 the youngest Indian prime minister.
