# Why in news?

 The Indian Chemical Council (ICC) received the 2024 OPCW The Hague Award at the 29th Session of the OPCW Conference of the States Parties in The Hague.

# **Key Points:**

- It is the implementing body of the **Chemical Weapons** Convention (CWC).
- Mission: To implement the provisions of the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC) in order to achieve the OPCW's vision of a world that is free of chemical weapons and of the threat of their use, and in which cooperation in chemistry for peaceful purposes for all is fostered.
- Its headquarters are located in The Hague, Netherlands.
- The OPCW receives states-parties' declarations detailing chemical weapons-related activities or materials and relevant industrial activities.
- The OPCW is authorized to perform inspections to verify that signatory states are complying with the convention.
- It also performs testing of sites and victims of suspected chemical weapons attacks.
- The OPCW was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2013.

# Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act, 1991

#### Why in news?

- The latest order available on the Supreme Court website regarding a pending case involving The Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act of 1991 dates back a year.
- This law prohibits the alteration of religious site statuses and maintains their character as it was on August 15, 1947.

# **Key Points:**

- It is described as an Act to prohibit conversion of any place of worship and to provide for the maintenance of the religious character of any place of worship.
- The Act declares that the religious character of a place of worship shall continue to be the same as it was on August 15, 1947
- It says that no person shall convert any place of worship of any religious denomination into one of a different denomination or section.
- Exemption:
  - The disputed site at Ayodhya was exempted from the Act.
     Due to this exemption, the trial in the Ayodhya case proceeded even after the enforcement of this law.

- This scheme aimed to offer medical coverage of Rs. 5 lakh per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalisation to poor and vulnerable families.
- The scheme covers over nearly 40% of the population targeted towards the poorest and the vulnerable.

# Eligibility

- The scheme is targeted to cover 10.74 crore poor, deprived rural families and identified occupational category of urban worker's families.
- The beneficiaries as identified by latest Socio-Economic Caste Census (SECC) data.

#### Benefits

- It provides cashless access to health care services for the beneficiary at the point of service, i.e., the hospital.
- Under the scheme every eligible family will be given Rs 5 lakh Insurance coverage benefit per year.
- It offers Health Benefit Packages which covers surgery, medical and day care treatments, cost of medicines and diagnostics.

# Foreign Direct Investment (FDI)

# Why in news?

 The Union government has proposed raising the FDI limit in the insurance sector to 100%.

# **Key Points:**

- Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) is a type of investment whereby residents of one country (home country) acquire ownership of assets of a firm in another country (host country) for controlling the production, distribution, and other activities.
- Example: Some common ones include establishing a subsidiary in another country, acquiring or merging with an existing foreign company, or starting a joint venture partnership with a foreign company.

# • Components:

# Equity capital:

It is the foreign direct investor's purchase of shares of an enterprise in a country other than its own.

# Reinvested earnings:

- It comprises the direct investors' share of earnings not distributed as dividends by affiliates, or earnings not remitted to the direct investor.
- Such retained profits by affiliates are reinvested.

# Intra-company loans:

■ These refer to short- or long-term borrowing and lending of funds between direct investors (or enterprises) and affiliate enterprises.
