### **Key Points:**

- Guru Nanak (1469–1539), also referred to as Baba Nanak, was the founder of Sikhism and the first of the ten Sikh Gurus.
- Guru Nanak laid the foundation for the three pillars of Sikhism: Naam Japna (meditating on God's name), Kirat Karni (honest and truthful living), and Vand Chakna (sharing with others, especially those in need).
- He was a poet, a mystic, a philosopher, and a singer who denounced ritualism as well as discrimination against women and those of lower socioeconomic status.
- Guru Nanak rejected the caste system and promoted the idea of equality among all people, regardless of their background, caste, or gender.

It also allows for the optional use of Hindi or other official languages in High Court judgments.</li></ul></ul></li></ul></li></ul>

- The WB is the collective name for the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) and International **Development Association (IDA)**, two of five international organizations owned by the WB Group.
- The WB Group, which is the parent organization of the WB, includes -
  - 0 **IBRD:** It provides loans, credits and grants.
  - IDA: It provides low or no-interest loans to low-income countries.
  - o International Finance Corporation (IFC): It provides investment, advice and asset management to private companies and governments.
  - Multilateral Guarantee Agency (MIGA): It insures lenders and investors against political risk such as war.
  - International Centre for the Settlement of Investment Disputes (ICSID): It settles investment-disputes between investors and countries.


