

<p><b>KUDA Master Plan 2041</b></p>  <p>MASTER PLAN - 2041 For Kakatiya Development Area</p>	<p><b>Why in news?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Telangana government has approved the <b>Master Plan-2041 for the Kakatiya (Warangal) Development Area</b>, as per the Government Order (G.O.) Ms. No. 202 issued by the Municipal Administration and Urban Development (MA&amp;UD) Department.</li> </ul> <p><b>Key Points:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The plan covers an area of 1,805 sq. km across 181 revenue villages.</li> <li>Its objective is to <b>guide the urban development of Warangal and its surrounding areas for the next 20 years.</b></li> <li>The Master Plan was prepared by the <b>Kakatiya Urban Development Authority (KUDA).</b></li> <li>The plan <b>includes land use zoning and regulations to promote general development.</b></li> <li>Public consultations were held, with inputs from technical review committees and district officials.</li> <li>The draft plan was notified in 2018, inviting public objections and suggestions for a <b>90-day period.</b></li> </ul>
<p><b>Kaleshwaram lift irrigation project</b></p>	<p><b>Why in news?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Telangana achieves record paddy harvest without using Kaleshwaram water.</li> </ul> <p><b>Key Points:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Location:</b> KLIP is a multipurpose irrigation project on the Godavari River i.e, at Kaleshwaram village in Telangana.</li> <li>The <b>Pranhita-Godavari river confluence is the location of KLIP.</b></li> <li>The <b>Wardha, Painganga, and Wainganga rivers</b>, which together make up the seventh-largest drainage basin on the subcontinent, come together at the confluence of the Pranahita River.</li> <li>It is claimed to be the <b>world's largest multi-stage and multi-purpose lift irrigation project.</b></li> </ul>

### Government Borrowings

#### Why in news?

- The Telangana government seems to be proceeding cautiously with increasing market borrowings through the auction of state government securities by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

#### Key Points:

- Borrowing is a loan **taken by the government and falls under capital receipts** in the Budget document.
- Usually, the Government borrows through the issue of government securities called **G-secs and Treasury Bills**.
- If the government resorts to larger borrowings, more than what it has projected, then its interest costs also go up risking higher fiscal deficit. That hurts the government's finances.
- Larger borrowing programme means that the public debt will go up and especially at a time when the GDP growth is subdued, it will lead to a higher debt-to-GDP ratio
