Chief Minister's Relief Fund	<ul> <li>Why in news?</li> <li>Assistance from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF) in Telangana nearly doubled this year, with ₹830 crore allocated for the expensive treatments that are beyond the reach of the poor.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Key Points: <ul> <li>The Relief amount is being released solely on the basis of the discretionary powers of the Hon'ble Chief Minister.</li> <li>No budgetary allocation is made for the CMRF.</li> <li>The donations made by the general public, Corporate Institutions, Board-Corporations and others constitute the CMRF.</li> <li>Chief Minister's Relief Fund aims to provide assistance to people affected by calamities and those in distress, and undertake activities of a charitable nature.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Telangana's HIV rate halves over 14 years	<ul> <li>Why in news?</li> <li>Telangana has seen a notable decrease in HIV prevalence over the last 14 years, falling from 0.84% in 2010 to 0.44% in 2024, as reported by the Telangana State AIDS Control Society (TSACS).</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Key Points:</li> <li>AIDS, or Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome, is a chronic disease that occurs when the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) damages the body's immune system. <ul> <li>HIV is a virus that targets and weakens the body's immune system.</li> <li>If untreated, it can lead to Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS), a life-threatening condition where the immune system fails.</li> <li>People living with AIDS are vulnerable to opportunistic infections and certain cancers.</li> <li>Transmission <ul> <li>Sexually transmitted : through contact with infected body fluids during sexual activity.</li> <li>Blood contact: including through sharing contaminated needles, and illicit injection drug use.</li> <li>Mother to child: during pregnancy, childbirth, or breastfeeding.</li> </ul> </li> </ul></li></ul>

	<ul> <li>Key Points:</li> <li>The Rythu Bharosa scheme is a financial assistance program in Telangana that provides farmers with annual support before the sowing season.</li> <li>The scheme aims to help farmers meet investment needs during the crop season so they can source quality inputs and services.</li> <li>Farmers receive Rs. 13,500 per year, with Rs. 7,500 from the state government and Rs. 6,000 from the central government.</li> </ul>
River Krishna	<ul> <li>Why in news?</li> <li>Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy urged officials to advocate for Telangana's share of 70% of the water allocation in the Krishna basin, as the river flows through 70% of Telangana's area and 30% of Andhra Pradesh's.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Key Points: <ul> <li>It is a river in south-central India.</li> <li>In terms of water inflows and river basin, Krishna is the fourth biggest river after Ganga, Godavari, and Brahmaputra.</li> <li>Origin: It rises in western Maharashtra state in the Western Ghats range near the town of Mahabaleshwar, about 64 km from the Arabian Sea.</li> <li>It passes through Maharashtra, Karnataka, Telangana, and Andhra Pradesh and meets the Bay of Bengal at</li> </ul></li></ul>
