Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act (2014)	<ul> <li>Why in news?</li> <li>The Chief Secretaries of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana reached an agreement on several matters during a two-hour meeting at the APIIC office in Mangalagiri in Andhra Pradesh on Monday.</li> <li>They resolved to distribute labour cess amounting to Rs 861 crore between the two States.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Key Points:</li> <li>The Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Bill, 2014 was introduced in Lok Sabha on February 13, 2014 by the Minister for Home Affairs, Mr. Sushil Kumar Shinde.</li> <li>The Bill provides for the reorganisation of the state of Andhra Pradesh. It carves out a separate state called Telangana comprising 10 districts of the existing state of Andhra Pradesh.</li> <li>Andhra Pradesh and Telangana will have a common capital, Hyderabad, for 10 years. After this period, Hyderabad shall be the capital of Telangana only. The central government will constitute an expert committee to recommend a new capital for Andhra Pradesh within 45 days of this Bill's enactment.</li> <li>Revenue Distribution: The resources allocated by the 13th Finance Commission to the existing state of Andhra Pradesh will be apportioned between the two successor states on the basis of population ratio and other parameters.</li> </ul>

Cheyutha Scheme	<ul> <li>Why in news?</li> <li>The Congress government, in its first year in office, spent Rs 61,516 crore implementing welfare schemes in the state.</li> <li>Of this, Rs 20,617 crore was spent on waiving crop loans and Rs 11,382 crore on providing pensions under the Cheyutha Scheme.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Key Points:</li> <li>This scheme provides free medical and healthcare up to Rs 10 lakh for economically backward families in Telangana.</li> <li>The scheme is part of the Rajiv Arogyasri initiative and offers 1,672 medical packages and 21 specialty services.</li> </ul>






