State of Punjab vs. Davinder Singh & Others	 Why in news? The One-Man Commission, led by retired IAS officer Rajiv Ranjan Mishra and formed by the State government to investigate the sub-classification of Scheduled Castes, has invited individuals who were unable to submit their representations directly to him. He mentioned that the sub-classification was being carried out in accordance with the Supreme Court's ruling in the State of Punjab vs. Davinder Singh & Others.
	 Key Points: The case was an appeal against a Punjab and Haryana High Court judgment that struck down a state law allowing the government to sub-classify SC/STs. In the 2024 case State of Punjab and Ors. v Davinder Singh and Ors., the Supreme Court of India ruled that sub-classification within the Scheduled Castes (SCs) is permissible: The court ruled 6-1 in favor of sub-classification, overturning the E.V. Chinnaiah judgment The court allowed the state to identify and provide separate quotas for more backward sub-groups within SCs The court emphasized that sub-classification must be carefully justified and cannot result in exclusive reservations for any single sub-class The court stated that the state must provide empirical data to justify sub-classification, showing that the sub-class in question is not adequately represented The court stated that sub-classification is only permissible if there is a reservation for both the sub-class and the larger class
SwetchaSAT payload	 Why in news? Aerospace start-up N Space Tech, based in Tenali, is set to launch its first payload in the SwetchaSAT-Vx series. The SwetchaSAT-Vo will be aboard the Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV)-C60 mission. Key Points: The payload is one of 24 being tested on the fourth stage of the PSLV rocket under the PSLV Orbital Experimental Module (POEM-4) platform. The payload, developed entirely in-house by N Space Tech, is designed to advance communication technologies across a wide frequency range from UHF (Ultra High Frequency) to Ku-bands (K-under).









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	 Its indigenous communication, power, and payload subsystems emphasise local innovation and engineering. The key highlights of the SwetchaSAT-V0 mission is the validation of an indigenously developed UHF communication module, which aims to strengthen global satellite communication systems.

SKATE SCEANIA	 Key Points: The Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar (PMRBP) is an initiative aimed at celebrating the remarkable energy, determination, ability, zeal, and enthusiasm of children in India. The awards will be conferred by the Honorable President of India at New Delhi during a special ceremony/function held in January every year.
Person in news: Shyam Benegal	 Why in news? Chandrababu Naidu paid his respects to the esteemed filmmaker Shyam Benegal, honoring his significant contributions to Indian cinema.
	 Key Points: Shyam Benegal was an Indian film director, screenwriter and documentary filmmaker. Often regarded as the pioneer of parallel cinema, he is widely considered as one of the greatest filmmakers post 1970s. He has received several accolades, including eighteen National Film Awards, a Filmfare Award and a Nandi Award. In 2005, he was honoured with the Dadasaheb Phalke Award, India's highest award in the field of cinema. In 1976, he was honoured by the Government of India with the Padma Shri, the fourth-highest civilian honour of the country, and in 1991, he was awarded Padma Bhushan,the third-highest civilian honour for his contributions in the field of arts.
Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease	 Why in news? According to data from a private hospital around 10% of paediatric outpatients were found with HFMD symptoms in the past three months in Ongole.
	 Key Points: Hand, foot, and mouth disease (HFM) is a viral infection common in young children that causes painful red blisters in the mouth and throat, and on the hands, feet, and diaper area. HFMD is characterized by blisters or sores in the mouth and a rash on the hands and feet. The infection can affect people of all ages, but it usually occurs in children under age 5.












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- It's caused by viruses from the **non-polio Enterovirus genus**.
