<p><b>World Bank</b></p>	<p><b>Why in news?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The World Bank has approved an <b>\$800 million loan to develop Amaravati into a model capital.</b></li> </ul> <p><b>Key Points:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The WB is an <b>international financial institution that provides loans and grants to the governments of low and middle-income/developing countries for the purpose of pursuing capital projects.</b></li> <li>It was established along with the <b>IMF at the 1944 Bretton Woods Conference.</b></li> <li>The WB is the collective name for the <b>International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) and International Development Association (IDA), two of five international organisations owned by the WB Group.</b></li> <li><b>About Amaravati:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Amaravati project is a <b>greenfield city development in Andhra Pradesh.</b></li> <li>The city is being <b>built along the banks of the Krishna River in Guntur District.</b></li> <li>The project is being <b>developed on 217.23 sq km of land, with an estimated population of 3.5 million by 2050.</b></li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<p><b>Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal-II (KWDT-II)</b></p>	<p><b>Why in news?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Telangana to submit rejoinder to Andhra Pradesh's arguments before KWDT-2.</li> </ul> <p><b>Key Points:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal-II was constituted by the Centre in April 2004 under Section 3 of the ISRWD Act, 1956 to adjudicate and resolve water-sharing disputes related to the Krishna River.</li> <li>It was constituted to address the allocation of Krishna River waters among the riparian states of Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh.</li> <li>KWDT-II made recommendations and allocations of Krishna River waters based on the availability of water, the demands of the states, and other relevant factors. It provided specific quantities of water to each state, outlining the share they were entitled to receive.</li> </ul>
<p><b>World Telugu Writers' Mahasabha</b></p>	<p><b>Why in news?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The World Telugu Writers' Mahasabha will take place in Vijayawada on December 28 and 29.</li> <li>In tribute to two notable figures in Telugu history, the venue will be named after Potti Sriramulu, while the main stage will honour the late Ramoji Rao, founder of the Eenadu group.</li> </ul>

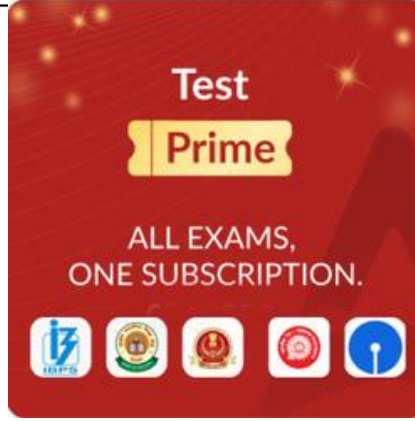
