Why in news?

 Leaders from Andhra Pradesh pay their respects to former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh.

Key Points:

- Dr. Manmohan Singh born on 26th September 1932 in Gah, Punjab (now in Pakistan), his life was shaped by the aftermath of Partition of India and Pakistan in 1947, which led his family to migrate to India.
- Literary Contributions: India's Export Trends and Prospects for Self-Sustained Growth.
- Economic Administration: Held critical government positions, including Chief Economic Advisor, Secretary of Economic Affairs, Governor of the Reserve Bank of India, and Chairman of the University Grants Commission.
- Contributions as Prime Minister (2004–2014): India's 14th Prime Minister, Dr. Manmohan Singh, served as India's third-longest-serving Prime Minister, after Jawaharlal Nehru and Indira Gandhi (excluding PM Narendra Modi, who is currently serving his third term).
- Awards: Padma Vibhushan (1987), the Jawaharlal Nehru Birth Centenary Award (1995), and multiple Finance Minister of the Year awards from Asia Money (1993, 1994) and Euro Money (1993).
 - He also won the Adam Smith Prize (1956) and the Wright's Prize (1955) from the University of Cambridge.

- The Self-Reliance neither signifies any exclusionary or isolationist strategies but involves creation of a helping hand to the whole world.
- The Mission focuses on the importance of promoting "local" products.
- The Mission would be based on five pillars namely,
 - Economy
 - o Infrastructure
 - System
 - Vibrant Demography
 - Demand

Doli-free Andhra Pradesh' mission

Why in news?

 As part of the 'doli-free Andhra Pradesh' mission, the Anakapalli district administration has initiated steps to provide road connectivity to 17 tribal habitations spread over four mandals.

Key Points:

 The 'Doli-free Andhra Pradesh' mission is a significant initiative launched by the Andhra Pradesh government aimed at eradicating the practice of carrying sick or dead individuals in traditional wooden stretchers

called dolis.

 This practice is often seen in rural areas, where people are carried on makeshift stretchers to healthcare facilities or for last rites due to the lack of proper transportation or infrastructure.

Objective:

- The mission's primary goal is to ensure that no person is carried in a doli (a traditional stretcher) for medical emergencies, transportation to hospitals, or funerals.
- The initiative seeks to provide better alternatives to improve access to healthcare and ensure dignity in the process of transferring people.
- Twenty-one works are under way at an estimated cost of ₹21.79 crore, and the authorities expect to complete most of them by Sankranti
