Why in news?

 Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu announced that the TDP-led NDA government will roll out every developmental initiative in Kuppam as a pilot project before extending it to the rest of the state.

Key Points:

- It is a government scheme launched on February 15, 2024, that aims to provide free electricity to households in India.
- Under the scheme, households will be provided with a subsidy to install solar panels on their roofs.
- The subsidy will cover up to 40% of the cost of the solar panels.
- The benefits of the scheme include:
 - Free electricity for households.
 - Reduced electricity costs for the government.
 - o Increased use of renewable energy.
 - o Reduced carbon emissions.

Eligibility:

- The household must be an Indian citizen.
- The household must own a house with a roof that is suitable for installing solar panels.
- The household must have a valid electricity connection.
- The household must not have availed any other subsidy for solar panels.

Human Metapneumovirus (HMPV)

Why in news?

- A panel of experts has been established to provide technical advice to the Andhra Pradesh government regarding HMPV.
- As per Central government guidelines, confirmatory testing will be conducted at the National Institute of Virology (NIV) in Pune, which will also supply testing kits to ICMR-recognised virology labs.

Key Points:

- Human Metapneumovirus (HMPV) is an RNA virus belonging to the Metapneumovirus genus in the Pneumoviridae family.
- It was **first identified in 2001** by Dutch scientists studying respiratory illnesses in children.
- HMPV primarily spreads through:
 - Respiratory droplets during coughing or sneezing.
 - Direct contact with infected individuals.
 - Contaminated surfaces in shared environments

Key Points: The Election Commission of India (ECI) is an autonomous constitutional authority responsible for administering Union and State election processes in India. The body administers elections to the Lok Sabha, Rajya Sabha, and State Legislative Assemblies in India, and the offices of the President and Vice President in the country. It is not concerned with the elections to panchayats and municipalities in the states. For this, the Constitution of India provides for a separate State Election Commission.
