<p>Telangana Clean and Green Energy Policy</p>	<p>Why in news?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> With an aim to achieve an additional 20,000 MW of renewable energy and storage capacity by 2030, the state government has unveiled "Telangana Clean and Green Energy Policy". The policy aims to drive substantial economic growth, attracting investments of Rs 1.98 lakh crore and creating 1.14 lakh jobs over the next decade. <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The policy highlights the promotion of floating solar projects to maximise the use of Telangana reservoirs. Rooftop solar installations will also be encouraged on government schools, buildings and Indiramma houses. SHGs will be encouraged to set up distributed solar plants of 500KW to 2 MW. The policy offered major incentives for renewable energy projects including: 100% reimbursement of stamp for land purchased for solar, wind, pumped storages, BESS and other renewable energy projects and capital subsidy will be provided on the Fixed Capital Investment (FCI) which will be disbursed over five years from the commercial operation date.
<p>Operation Smile-XI</p>	<p>Why in news?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Women & Children Safety Wing (W&CSW), in partnership with the Anti-Human Trafficking Unit (AHTU), launched 'Operation Smile-XI' during a convergence meeting at the Cyberabad Commissionerate. <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The initiative aims to trace missing children and rescue those forced into begging, rag picking, child labour, trafficking, and bonded labour. The month-long operation, which ends on January 31, focuses on rescuing and rehabilitating homeless children and those trapped in exploitative conditions.
<p>Rythu Bharosa scheme</p>	<p>Why in news?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> CM Revanth Reddy announces that the Rythu Bharosa scheme will provide Rs 12,000 per acre of cultivable land annually.



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Under the scheme, farmers will receive Rs 6,000 per acre each season, totaling Rs 12,000 per acre for the entire year. <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> program for farmers in Telangana that aims to help them meet their investment needs during the crop season. The scheme provides farmers with an annual financial assistance of ₹13,500. Of this, ₹7,500 is provided by the state government and ₹6,000 by the central government. The amount is directly deposited into the beneficiary's bank account.
<p>Telangana Bhu Bharati (Record of Rights) Act</p>	<p>Why in news?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Revenue department has initiated the process of framing rules for land administration under the Telangana Bhu Bharati (Record of Rights in Land) Bill, 2024. The new rules are aimed at guiding the Revenue administration in dealing with the applications. <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The new Act has provision for creation of Bhudhar, record for all land parcels across the State and issuance of Bhudhaar cards for protecting the ownership rights as well as ensuring access to the land details with a click of mouse. This bill aims to amend the existing Record of Rights (RoR act) Act, replacing the outdated Dharani portal with the innovative Bhumata portal as an online platform to improve land registration process. Bhudhaar” means the land parcel unique identification number assigned to any parcel of land, as contained in the Record of Rights, in such manner as may be prescribed which includes – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> “Temporary Bhudhaar” - a Bhudhaar assigned to indicate that the Geo-referencing of the parcel of land or lands appurtenant to the property has not been completed. “Permanent Bhudhaar” - a Bhudhaar assigned to indicate that the Geo-referencing of the parcel of land or lands appurtenant to the property has been completed. Bhudhaar Card” means a document prepared or generated and maintained in an electronic form in such format as may be prescribed describing a parcel or parcels of land as contained in the Record of Rights, and specifying the Bhudhaar Number or



	Numbers assigned to such parcel or parcels.
Virtual Safari - Hyderabad	<p>Why in news?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> India's first-ever virtual reality wildlife safari was hosted by Hyderabad. Using advanced VR technology, visitors are immersed in a simulated forest environment, providing an up-close experience with majestic big cats such as tigers and lions. <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Spanning a 2-kilometer track, the park allows visitors to journey through the jungle environment, experiencing it all through advanced virtual reality. The features include thrilling safari ride, a forest walk, a VR experience zone, orbital 9D cinema, 360-degree indoor theatre, and guardians of the wild. The park also offers an innovative fishing simulation, allowing visitors to reel in fish or try their hand at kayaking without even going to a lake or river.
