The government accepted and declared the day National Science Day. The first National Science Day was celebrated on February 28, 1987. Why in news? Key Points:

- Kolam tribes, also known as Kolamboli, Kulme and Kolmi, occupy a major portion of Madhya Pradesh.
- The main concentration of this tribe is on the plains and in the mountainous region.
- These tribal groups are reckoned as scheduled tribes and apart from Madhya Pradesh they reside in some parts of Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh.
- They are listed as Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group (PVTG) in the state of Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh.
- They speak a Dravidian language called Kolami, and nearly all of the adults also speak Marathi, Telugu, or Gondi.
- They also speak other languages like Marathi, Telugu or Gondi.
- For writing, this Kolma tribal community uses the famous Devanagari script.

Why in news?

 An archaeological find has emerged on the outskirts of Gudipalli, a mandal headquarters in Nalgonda district, where uncommon Iron Age structures have been uncovered.

Key Points:

- The Iron Age was a period in human history that started between 1200 B.C. and 600 B.C., depending on the region, and followed the Stone Age and Bronze Age.
- The Iron Age existed in Africa, Europe, and Asia during prehistoric times in the Old World.
- Ironwork first began in Turkey before spreading to other European countries.
- People used iron to make strong tools, which made farming easier.
- Timeline of Iron Usage in India:
 - Period in which humans entered the Iron Age varied from region to another. Therefore, the subsequent excavations in India have kept on pushing back the earliest date of iron usage.
 - 1300 BCE: As per 1979 excavation at Ahar, Rajasthan.
 - o 1530 BCE: Excavation at Bukkasagara, Karnataka.
 - 1700-1800 BCE: Excavation at Raipura in the Mid-Ganga valley.
 - 1900-2000 BCE: Excavation at Malhar near Varanasi and Brahmagiri in North Karnataka.

Kalyana Chalukyas

- Two gold coins of Akkadevi, the Kalyani Chalukya princess who ruled parts of present-day Karnataka in the 11th century CE, have been discovered in Telangana.
- The coins were found near Madugula village in Telangana and have inscriptions in the Kannada language with characters of the 11th century CE.

Key Points:

- The Chalukyas ruled over the central Indian plateau of the Deccan between the sixth and twelfth centuries.
- During that period, they ruled as three closely related but individual dynasties.
- The Chalukyas of Badami, who ruled between the sixth and eighth centuries, and the two sibling dynasties of the Chalukyas of Kalyani, or the Western Chalukyas, and the Chalukyas of Vengi, or the Eastern Chalukyas.

About Kalyana Chalukyas:

- It is a Kannadiga dynasty, they were known after their capital city, Kalyani. It is present in the modern-day Bidar district of Karnataka.
- The empire was established by Tailapa II when the Western Chalukya was a feudatory of the Rashtrakuta Empire and Tailapa II governed Tardavadi in the Bijapur district of Karnataka.
- It is considered the most successful period of the later Chalukya rulers in Karnataka's history, and many scholars refer to this period as the 'Chalukya Vikrama era'.
