Article 82 of the Constitution mandates that after each Census, the allocation of Lok Sabha seats must be adjusted based on population changes. Article 81 limits the total number of Lok Sabha members to 550, with 530 from states and 20 from Union Territories. It also requires that the ratio of seats to the population in each state be as uniform as possible, ensuring that constituencies across the country have roughly equal populations. History of Delimitation in India: Pre-1976: After the Censuses of 1951, 1961, and 1971, seats in Lok Sabha, Rajya Sabha, and state Assemblies were redistributed. 42nd Amendment (1976): During the Emergency, Parliament froze the total number of seats until the 2001 Census to prevent states with higher population growth from losing representation while implementing family planning measures. 2001 Delimitation: While constituency boundaries
	were redrawn, the number of seats remained unchanged due to opposition from southern states. • Concerns of Southern States Over Delimitation: Southern states fear that delimitation based on the latest population data will reduce their representation in Parliament, weakening their political influence. Tamil Nadu CM M.K. Stalin announced an all-party meeting on March 5 to discuss delimitation, calling it a looming threat to southern states. He warned that Tamil Nadu could lose parliamentary

Act East Policy & Look East Policy	 Why in news? The Vice-President highlighted that India's 'Look East' policy has evolved into 'Act East,' leading to significant progress in the Northeast.
	Key Points: About Act East Policy: The 'Act East Policy' announced in November, 2014 is the upgrade of the "Look East Policy". It is a diplomatic initiative to promote economic, strategic and cultural relations with the vast Asia-Pacific region at different levels. It involves intensive and continuous engagement with Southeast Asian countries in the field of connectivity, trade, culture, defence and people-to-people-contact at bilateral, regional and multilateral levels. Key advancements: Greater emphasis on action-oriented outcomes. Integration of Northeast India as a critical fulcrum in policy implementation. Recognition of the Indo-Pacific as a strategic and economic priority. About Look East Policy: Introduced by PM PV Narasimha Rao in the early 1990s after the Cold War ended. Aimed to rectify India's neglect of Southeast Asia despite deep cultural and historical ties. Primary objectives: Enhance trade and economic development. Forge stronger strategic and cultural connections with ASEAN nations. Draw inspiration from the economic success stories of East Asia.
ACADA system	Why in news? The Indian Army took steps in modernising its defence capabilities. It signed a contract for the procurement of 223 Automatic Chemical Agent Detection and Alarm (ACADA) systems from L&T Limited. This initiative aims to boost the Army's ability to detect chemical warfare agents and toxic industrial chemicals.
	 Key Points: The ACADA system is a sophisticated device that detects chemical warfare agents and toxic industrial chemicals. It operates by sampling air from the environment. This system is crucial for both military operations and disaster



Why in news?

- NASA's SPHEREx space telescope is set to launch, aiming to explore the origins of the universe and search for water and organic molecules in the Milky Way.
- This mission will create a 3D map of the cosmos, providing insights into cosmic inflation and the formation of galaxies.

Key Points:

- SPHEREx stands for Spectro-Photometer for the History of the Universe, Epoch of Reionization, and Ices Explorer.
- Launched By: NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration).

Aim of SPHEREx:

- **Study Cosmic Inflation:** Investigate the rapid expansion of the universe after the Big Bang.
- Map Galaxies: Survey over 450 million galaxies to understand their distribution and evolution.
- Search for Water and Organic Molecules: Identify reservoirs of water and life-essential molecules in the Milky Way.
- Create a 3D Cosmic Map: Develop a detailed map of the universe in 102 color bands.

Significance:

- Insight into Cosmic Inflation: Helps scientists understand the universe's exponential expansion after the Big Bang.
- Search for Life's Building Blocks: Detects water and organic molecules in star-forming regions and planetary systems.
- Foundation for Future Missions: Provides data to guide upcoming space exploration projects.
- Global Collaboration: Involves international partners like the Korea Astronomy and Space Science Institute.
