<p>Madhav National Park</p>	<p>Why in news?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Centre has designated Madhav National Park in Madhya Pradesh as the 58th tiger reserve in the country. The newly designated Tiger Reserve is also the ninth one from the state to receive this recognition. <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is located in the state of Madhya Pradesh. It is situated on the northern fringe of the Central Highlands of India, forming a part of the Upper Vindhyan Hills intermixed with plateaus and valley sections. Lakes: Sakhya Sagar and Madhav Sagar are the two lakes in the southern part of the park, providing the aquatic biodiversity and lifeline for the terrestrial species. The eastern part of the park has sedimentary rocks of the Vindhyan system, which are mostly sandstone, shale and limestones. Flora: Kardhai, Salai, Dhaora and Khair. The understory comprises almost entirely of Ber, Makor and Karonda. The jamun and mahua are found along the nullahs. Fauna: Nilgai, Chinkara and Chowsinga and Deer including Chital, Sambar and Barking Deer. Animals like the Leopard, Wolf, Jackal, Fox, Wild Dog etc.
<p>Tejas Mk1A</p>	<p>Why in news?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The rear fuselage for the Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas Mk1A, produced by Alpha Tocol Engineering Services Private Ltd., a private sector company, was handed over to Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd. (HAL). <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is a 4.5-generation single-seat supersonic multirole fighter aircraft. It is India's second indigenous fighter jet after the HAL HF-24 Marut. It is designed for offensive air support, close combat, and ground attack roles. It has three production models: Tejas Mark 1, Mark 1A, and trainer variant. Features: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is the smallest and lightest in its class of contemporary supersonic combat aircraft. It features a fin but lacks a horizontal tail. The aircraft weighs approximately 5,450 kg and has a maximum take-off weight of 13,500 kg.



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ It is powered by a single-uprated General Electric F404-GE-IN20 engine. ○ It is designed to carry a range of air-to-air, air-to-surface, precision-guided weapons.
Ladki Bahin Yojana	<p>Why in news?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Recently, the Ladki Bahin Yojana has disbursed ₹17,500 crore to 2.38 crore women. <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The Mukhyamantri Majhi Ladki Bahin Yojana, commonly referred to as the Ladki Bahin Yojana, is a key welfare program introduced by the Maharashtra government in 2024. ● It aims to provide financial support to economically disadvantaged women aged 21 to 65, promoting their rehabilitation, economic development, and empowerment. ● Eligibility Criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Age Limit: The applicant should be between 21 and 65 years old. ○ Family Income: The combined annual income of the applicant's family must not exceed ₹2.5 lakh. ○ Income Tax: No family member should be an income taxpayer. ● Benefits: Under this scheme, eligible women will receive Rs 1,500 per month through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT).
TROPEX-25	<p>Why in news?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The 2025 Edition of the Indian Navy's capstone Theatre Level Operational Exercise (TROPEX) was conducted over a period of three months from Jan to Mar 25. ● The exercise construct included an Amphibious Exercise - AMPHEX, a Joint Work Up Phase focused on precise delivery of ordnance on target, Cyber and Electronic Warfare, and a Tactical Phase. <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Theatre Level Operational Readiness Exercise (TROPEX) is the Indian Navy's largest biennial maritime exercise, testing combat readiness and joint warfighting capabilities. ● Hosted by India, the exercise is conducted across the Indian Ocean Region (IOR), including strategic maritime zones. ● Led by the Indian Navy, with substantial participation from the Indian Army, Air Force, and Coast Guard. ● Key Features & Objectives: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Focuses on maritime security, anti-submarine warfare, cyber and electronic warfare, and live weapon firings. ○ Tests integrated response strategies against conventional, asymmetric, and hybrid threats. ○ Includes joint work-up phases, amphibious exercises,



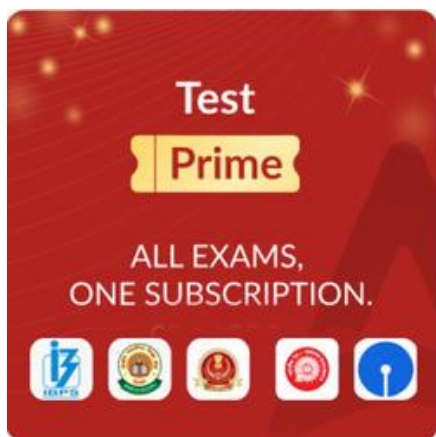

Rashtriya Karmayogi Jan Seva Programme	Why in news?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Department of Social Justice and Empowerment (DoSJE), Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, successfully inaugurated the first batch of the Rashtriya Karmayogi Jan Seva Programme. The initiative, launched by Capacity Building Commission, aims at fostering a stronger sense of Seva Bhav (spirit of service) among government officials who are solution oriented, compassionate, and citizen-focused. <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is an interactive event aimed to inspire, enlighten, and guide Central Government employees to adopt the Karmayogi Way, emphasizing a citizen-centric approach to governance. The initiative is launched by the Capacity Building Commission. The programme focused on fostering Seva-Bhav (a sense of service) and accountability. <p>About Mission KarmaYogi:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In 2020, the Government of India launched Mission Karmayogi, a National Programme for Civil Services Capacity Building (NPCSCP). It is anchored by an apex body and headed by the Prime Minister. The programme aims at building a future-ready civil service with the right attitude, skills and knowledge, aligned to the vision of New India. <p>About Capacity Building Commission:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It was established in 2021. It is a three-member Commission, supported by an internal Secretariat headed by a Secretary. Members have been appointed from diverse backgrounds such as private sector, academia, public sector, and civil society. The Commission's focus is on driving stand harmonisation across the public sector learning and development landscape.
Namami Gange Programme	Why in news?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Under the Namami Gange Programme, project implementation accelerated after completing preparatory activities. Of the Rs. 20,424.82 Crore allocated for 2014-15 to 2023-24, NMCG has disbursed Rs. 16,648.49 Crore, which is 82% of the budget.

Key Points:

- It is an integrated conservation mission, approved as 'Flagship Programme' by the Union Government in 2014 with budget outlay of Rs.20,000 Crores.
- It is administered by the Ministry of Jal Shakti's Department of Water Resources, River Development and Ganga Rejuvenation, to accomplish the twin objectives of -
 - Effective abatement of pollution,
 - Conservation and rejuvenation of National River Ganga.
- The program would be implemented by the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), and its state counterpart organisations i.e., State Program Management Groups (SPMGs).
 - NMCG is the implementation wing of National Ganga Council (NGC), which replaced the National Ganga River Basin Authority.
 - NGC was created in 2016 under the River Ganga (Rejuvenation, Protection and Management) Authorities Order, 2016, and is headed by the PM.
- **Its implementation has been divided into:**
 - Entry-Level Activities (for immediate visible impact),
 - Medium-Term Activities (to be implemented within 5 years of time frame) and
 - Long-Term Activities (to be implemented within 10 years).
