	<ul> <li>Key Points:         It aims at providing digital training to farmers to enhance their knowledge on the changing scenario of farming and agriculture practices.         It is envisaged to equip farmers with the knowledge about the latest technologies available from lab to land, and to leverage smartphones to obtain vital information regarding the agriculture patterns, market prices, and digital transactions.     </li> <li>It's a pilot project launched in the Chittoor district, by the State government.</li> </ul>

Election Commission of India (ECI)	Why in news?  ■ The Election Commission of India (ECI) has strongly objected to the Andhra Pradesh government's formation of a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe voter list irregularities in the Parchur constituency during the 2024 general elections.
	Permanent and independent body: The Election Commission of India is a permanent and independent constitutional authority, established under Article 324 of the Indian Constitution.      Primary role: ECI is responsible for conducting elections to the Parliament, state legislatures, and the offices of the President and Vice President of India.      It does not oversee elections for urban local bodies like municipalities and panchayats, which the State Election Commissions manage.      Functions and jurisdiction:
